

Superintendent's News & Events Report to the Board Regular Board Meeting of February 23, 2016

Serving the communities of Anmore, Belcarra, Coquitlam, Port Coquitlam and Port Moody

- 1. Mountain Meadows and Walton Elementary students and parents were treated to a very special lucky lion dance in celebration of the Chinese Lunar New Year on February 8.
- 2. Twenty-two Maple Creek Middle students travelled to Victoria to hear Real Acts of Caring Week (February 14 to 20) proclaimed for the entire province. Students also got to meet Premier Christy Clark. During RAC Week students throughout the district spread kindness and cheer by delivering flowers, handing out baked goods and planting a city garden.
- 3. Walton Elementary's read-a-thon raised \$13,200 for school library books with the help of parents, teachers and local businesses. Principal Mah also shaved his head for the cause!

New pedal desks have also been introduced at Panorama Heights Elementary to support self-regulation and enhance student learning.


