## Learning for a Lifetime

- Twelve graduation ceremonies were held over the past month celebrating the
  achievement of approximately 3,000 SD43 students and congratulating them on
  moving to the next phase of their lives. All the best to our graduates!
- 2. **Inquiry Hub Secondary** held its **first-ever graduation ceremony** this year for its 12 graduates. The innovative program is being touted as a <u>possible future model</u> for the B.C. curriculum.
- 3. Many schools in SD43 held **year-end events** to showcase and celebrate **student achievement and success**.
- 4. **Grade 5 students** at **Alderson Elementary** took part in the **Legislative Assembly of British Columbia's "Speakers in the Schools" program**. They were honoured with a visit by Madame Speaker, the **Honourable Linda Reid**, on June 14.
- Congratulations to Ranch Park Elementary teacher, Grace Lee, and her students on being awarded the Enthusiasm and Spirit Award for "A Little Thanks" – their song entry for the Sing Me A Song program. The award was presented by Lt. Gov. of B.C., Judith Guichon.
- 6. **Scott Creek Middle** raised \$17,500 for the Canadian Cancer Society through their participation in the Cops for Cancer initiative, the highest amount ever raised for Cops for Cancer beating their own record set the previous year.
- Over 20 SD43 schools fundraised for the Heart and Stroke Foundation by taking part in the Jump Rope for Heart program. Congratulations to Aspenwood Elementary for being the #1 fundraising school in the Fraser area and the #3 fundraising school overall in BC with a total of \$17,039.
- 8. **Terry Fox Secondary graduating students** helped <u>support Syrian refugee students</u> attending school in the Tri-Cities area to get a college education by donating at their grad ceremony. The fundraising was an initiative of the school's **2016 Legacy Club** and raised over \$6,000, double their original goal of \$3,000.
- 9. **Mountain Meadows Elementary** raised over \$3,000 for **Wigs 4 Kids BC** at an assembly where 12 people donated hair. Hairdressing students and teachers from **Gleneagle Secondary** assisted with the hair collection.
- 10. **Moody Middle** student **Kendal-Leah Skelton** <u>spent seven hours on the swings</u> at her school raising **\$2,000** for breast cancer research.
- 11. The Japanese club at **Gleneagle Secondary**, led by student **Takemasa Oyama**, raised over **\$1,000** and presented it to the Japanese consul in Vancouver for the victims of the **Kunamoto earthquake**. Their efforts earned them a <u>visit from Consul General of Japan</u>, Asako Okai, to the school on June 7.
- 12. Nolan Fahey, an EPIC (Elite Athletes and Performing Artists in Coquitlam) student at Eagle Mountain Middle, is <a href="starring">starring</a> in the lead role of the Arts Club Theatre Company production of <a href="starring">Billy Elliot</a> running at the Stanley Industrial Alliance Stage until July 10. Also part of the show are <a href="Eagle Mountain Middle">Eagle Mountain Middle</a> students <a href="Julia MacLean">Julia MacLean</a> and <a href="Nathan Piasecki">Nathan Piasecki</a>.

- 15. Three SD43 teachers have <u>earned a Loran Teachers Building Leaders Award</u>. Congratulations to **Joanne Steacy** and **Selwyn Tam** from **Port Moody Secondary**, and to **Warren Chang** from **Dr. Charles Best Secondary**.
- 16. Congratulations to **students** from **Harbour View Elementary** and **Mundy Road Elementary** for winning the **City of Coquitlam Emergency Preparedness Challenge**.
- 17. Lord Baden-Powell Elementary hosted an Inquiry Open House on June 9 showcasing how they have embraced their new curriculum. Their classrooms were set-up to display the student's inquiry projects about animals, ecosystems, biomes, and avatars
- 18. **36 students** from **CABE**, **CLC** and **Suwa'lkh Secondary** took part in the **Children of the Street Society annual youth art engagement project**. Over nine weeks, the students learned about how to prevent sexual exploitation and human trafficking. SD43 **Trustee Diane Sowden** is the society's executive director.
- 19. Students at **Centennial Secondary** created jackets for **Syrian refugee children** which were presented to **Encompass Principal Krisztine Trumley** and **Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS)** staff.
- 20. **Heritage Woods** student **Miranda Tsuyuki** won first place in the Grade 11 category in the **Polar Expressions National Student Short Story Contest** for her submission titled "Healed, Not Cured."
- 21. The Coquitlam School Athletics Association awards were announced on June 22. Among this year's winners included Port Coquitlam Secondary basekball coach Paul Langford winning the Gary Scott Award, Riverside Secondary basketball/soccer coach Kenny Jamieson winning the "Rising Star Coaches" award, Gleneagle Secondary coach Chris Turpin winning the Jim Stewart Builder Award, and Heritage Woods Secondary winning the Top School Aggregate award.
- 22. **Dr. Charles Best Secondary** <u>captured the BC boys AAA provincial soccer</u> <u>championship</u>. They out-scored their opponents by a combined 21-3 over five games at the provincial tournament, defeating North Vancouver's Argyle Secondary 5-1 in the championship final. **Matteo Polisi** won the MVP, while **Jared Jorvath** was picked top goalie.
- 23. Congratulations to the **Gleneagle Secondary golf team** to capturing the **AAA provincial championship** for the second year in a row! The team shot a combined
  584 to win the tournament by 14 strokes. **Gleneagle's A.J. Ewart** finished second in
  the tournament shooting a minus-2, one of only two players to finish under par.
- 24. Santiago Herrera, who is part of the EPIC program at Pinetree Secondary, will be competing in the taekwondo junior world championships in Burnaby this November. He had previously won the under-59-kilogram class at the junior nationals to qualify for the junior worlds.
