


Superintendent's News & Events Report to the Board

Regular Board Meeting of September 13, 2016

- 2. Successful Learning With Boundaries sessions were held on August 24 to 25. The two-day event was highlighted by presentations by Dr. Yong Zhao, an expert in the field of education whose works focus on the implications of globalization and technology on education. Thank you to district adminstrators for their hard work and diligence in preparing for a successful start to the school year.
- SD43 Board Chair Judy Shirra, Trustees Chuck Denison and Carol Cahoon, and Superintendent Patricia Gartland attended the 3rd annual Coquitlam Firefighters Charitable Gala on September 10. The gala <u>raised \$15,000 for the "Nutritional Breakfast/Snack Program"</u> to feed underprivileged and vulnerable children in the Coquitlam area.

Two SD43 teachers Paul Chaffee (Heritage Woods Secondary) and Tu Loan Trieu (Hillcrest Middle) have been selected to take part in the *Teachers Institute on Canadian Parliamentary Democracy* in Ottawa from October 30 to November 4, 2016. The experience provides an opportunity to explore Canada's national legislature alongside parliamentary experts and educators from across the country.
- 5. SD43 teachers have been demonstrating an innovative approach to student discipline by <u>practicing restorative justice</u> in their classrooms. SD43 has partnered with Simon Fraser University to provide teachers the opportunity to take a two-year graduate diploma program on restorative justice practices.

 blended family.
- Former Aspenwood Elementary student Ty Waters, now at Eagle Mountain Middle, released his first song titled "Only Human" on July 20. The song aims to inspire the world to come together by promoting peace among family and friends.
- 8. Led by an initiative that began by students at Pitt River Community School, <u>SD43</u> raised over \$25,000 for the Canadian Red Cross in support of Fort McMurray relief efforts through a Toonie Tuesday campaign.

 - Jarrett Chong (Riverside Secondary) won three gold medals at the <u>BC Summer Games in Abbotsford</u> and three gold medals at the <u>Legion National Youth Track and Field Championships in Sainte Therese, Quebec.</u>
 - Victoria Tocheva (Banting Middle) won five medals (3G, 1S, 1B) at the BC Summer Games.
 - Olivia Willett (Riverside Secondary) won a silver medal at the Legion Championships.
 - Jenevieve Patry-Smith (Terry Fox Secondary) won two bronze medals at the Legion Championships.
 - Jacqueline Lew (Pinetree Secondary) won a bronze medal at the Cadet Wrestling Pan American Championships in Lima, Peru.
 - Thomas Semple (Centennial Secondary) <u>earned a silver medal with Team Canada</u> at the FIL U-19 Men's Lacrosse World Championships in Coquitlam.
 - Harjun Dhaliwal (Centennial Secondary) won a gold medal with his ball hockey team at the under-15 Plzen Challenge Cup in the Czech Republic.
 - Jared MacLean (Heritage Woods Secondary) won the doubles championship at both the U16 and U18 provincial tennis championship earning him a spot at the national tennis championship.
