Regular Board Meeting of November 15, 2016

- SD43 Board Chair Judy Shirra and Superintendent Patricia Gartland visited Korea
 recently to sign a MOU with the United Nations Memorial Cemetery Secretariat to
 foster student exchanges promoting the importance of remembering the Korean
 War. They also attended meetings with ministry representatives, the embassy, and
 education bureaus that are very important to open doors for future student and
 teacher exchanges, and training programs.
- 2. **SD43** schools honoured those who served our country by holding assemblies in the week leading up to Remembrance Day. Students, staff, administrators and trustees also represented SD43 by attending ceremonies in the community.
- 3. **SD43** is the first school district in Western Canada to implement the SNAP program. SNAP (Stop Now And Plan) is a cognitive-behavioural strategy that helps children and parents regulate angry feelings by getting them to stop, think, and plan possible alternatives before they act impusively. Several staff have been trained and we are in the final stages of planning its implementation for the New Year.
- 4. Students across SD43 had the opportunity to attend WE Day on November 3, 2016 at Rogers Arena in Vancouver. WE is a movement that brings people together and gives them the tools to change the world. Also in attendance were Board Chair Judy Shirra, Board Vice-Chair Michael Thomas, Superintendent Patricia Gartland, and Associate Director of Instruction for Learning and Information Technologies Stephen Whiffin.
- 5. **Heritage Woods Secondary welcomed Svend Hansen**, a 93-year-old World War II Navy veteran, to speak to their students as part of their **Memory project**.
- Riverview Park Elementary was crowned the registration champions of the Coquitlam Public Library Summer Reading Club with over 31 percent of their students signed up. Nestor Elementary had won the previous four years.
- 7. Budding young journalists in Jennifer Whiffin's Grade 4/5 class at Anmore Elementary recently received a visit and some words of wisdom from Tri-City news reporter, Diane Strandberg.
- 8. Artwork from **Grade 4 and 5 students at Moody Elementary** were on display at Port Moody City Hall from November 7 to 12 to **celebrate Port Moody's veterans**.
- 9. Walton Elementary donated over 800 food items to the SHARE Food Bank as part of their Scare Away Hunger campaign.
- 10. **Gleneagle Secondary students** recently joined the Lower Mainland Green Team to help pull invasive weeds around the Shoreline Trail in Port Moody.
