Results of District Sustainability Interactive Workshop

On the October 21st Pro D Day, we, the energy, and sustainability team conducted a Sustainability Interactive Workshop for teachers around our district that focused on developing the sustainability culture in our schools.



The workshop discussed the successes of the different sustainability initiatives that we have developed in the past and brainstormed new ideas that we should all peruse in the future. This workshop was conducted at our newly inaugurated Education and Learning Centre building o Winslow Ave, Coquitlam. Post-workshop, a survey was conducted to assess the event and gauge the interest of teachers towards various sustainability initiatives. Here's a summary of the results:

Review of Westwood EL, Birchland EL, and Eagle Mountain Middle!

The energy management and sustainability team have recently engaged ESC automation to review Westwood Elementary and Birchland Elementary which have been high-energy consumers. The focus of this review is to optimize the system operations to ensure energy savings.

We also engaged ESC Automation to provide a final review at Eagle Mountain Middle to ensure the heating plant is prepared for winter. During the summer we had the Eagle Mountain mechanical system recommissioned. Now we expect to be able to use the heat pumps to heat the building with minimal support from gas-fired backup boilers reducing our GHG emissions.

Tree Planting continues at Kilmer El. and Eagle Mountain.

We want to continue to support our schools to get involved in planting trees and educating our students about the importance of trees. This month both Kilmer El and Eagle Mountain received young Dogwoods that students have planted in a continuation of creating outdoor learning spaces.

Kilmer - Last week students celebrated their new school trees with an outdoor dance party during recess. Thanks to School District 43 Sustainability Team and Tri-City Green Council we were able to plant one Dogwood tree and one Mountain Ash tree in the same area as a previously planted Maple tree. Over time these trees will expand the shade zone for students to play in during the warm and dry months of the year. As Kilmer is a Summer Learning site, shade is important 11 of 12 months each year 😂



In addition to planting the trees, students planted an assortment of tulips, hyacinths, and daffodils around each tree as well as in the established courtyard garden. They also topped up the classroom planter boxes with new garden soil and mulch. These bins were recently donated to the school by Tri-City Green Council.

Eagle Mountain – With the prize money won at last year's Eco-Challenge competition Eagle Mountain purchased a small Dogwood tree which a team of students planted this week in their courtyard to provide shade and a central piece for a new outdoor learning space.
