Cape Horn Elementary is the winner of the pizza lunch this Spring. Their checklist was randomly selected from among the other participants. Congratulations!






Eco-Challenge – Earth Day week

Giant Pumpkin Competition Update

Exciting news! We currently have 24 schools enrolled in our eagerly anticipated Pumpkin Growing Competition, and the journey has already begun. Your pumpkin plants are officially on their way to greatness!



Dave Keen, our local Giant Pumpkin growing expert along with a couple of his buddies have selected two seeds for each school. One is from Dave's monster winning pumpkin and the other is from a Prize winning large but not a Giant that will have a better chance to survive the summer ahead.

They have planted the seeds in pots and have them in a greenhouse to get them started. Depending on the weather we expect that they will be ready for planting in your pumpkin growing beds around the end of the month. So, select a spot and get it ready.

A pumpkin does not need an elaborate planting spot, you can plant it on school grounds, or a school can select an alternative planting spot such as a staff, student, or neighbor's place to provide better care over the summer.



\$200 will be given to the school with the biggest pumpkin to spend on anything to do with sustainability education. The big weigh-off will take place on Halloween 2024.



Discover how a simple question sparked a movement that engaged entire communities, leading to innovative challenges like the Power Out Challenge and neighborhood cleanups.









Keep Plastic Bags Out of the Green Bin



When they end up in the green bin, they can cause operational problems, may not break down properly during processing, an may contaminate the finished compost.

Parchment and Wax Paper Go in the Garbage



Most parchment and wax papers today have a plastic coating so don't put them in the green bin. Do the Tea Bag Tear Test





If your tea bag tears easily when wet, it's made of paper and can go in the green bin. If it doesn't rip easily, it's probably made of plastic, and goes in the garbage.
