ADOPTION OF MAY 10, 2023 AGM MEETING MINUTES AND OCTOBER AGENDA - ATASH, CHAIR

- Forwarded by Kamilah and seconded by Christine
- All in favour, none opposed.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - ATASH, CHAIR (ON BEHALF OF MR. PEARSE)

There was no Principals' Report as Frank was absent. Frank passed on his notes to Atash to share at the meeting:

- The school will have a formal, grand opening celebration
- Monday, October 23, 2023 5pm-7pm
- sometimes MLA comes, representatives from the school district will be here
- Frank needs volunteers to help out with the event. For example, direct parking traffic, ushers, cake cutters, etc.
- Will likely be held indoors. In the gym
- It's usually open to school's community, as well as the neighbourhood community

Via his notes, Frank also brought up that the Learning Commons teacher is planning to organize a Scholastic Book Fair

- All proceeds/ funding goes back to the school's library
- She is looking for volunteers. Dec 1 set-up day needs help. The Book Fair sale takes place from Dec 4 (or 5?) to Dec 8th during school time. The kids will get to look around as a class and make purchases.
- Wants to do an evening session just for parents only.
- Take down day is Dec 11. Needs volunteers too
- For people who are interested to volunteer, send email to PAC

School has several long-term fundraising goals:

- \$50,000 -\$100,000 to extend our playground at back of school
- \$5,000 to buy more laptops and tablets
- \$5,000 to spend on STEAM learning materials such as robotic games, bumble bee robot games, etc.) STEAM = ScienceTechnologyEngineerArtMathetic

DPAC UPDATE - ANDREA, DPAC REP

- At a recent DPAC meeting, there was a PAC 101 presentation: Every parent is part of PAC and District PAC. The executives are elected and the 4 positions are needed to fulfill the constitution. PAC can create various positions such as, Communication Coordinator, Volunteers Coordinator.
- PAC is a great opportunity to get to know other parents and get involved.
- DPAC is our connection with the district
- There is a PAC 101 presentation available online at www.DPAC43.ca. Has other good resources too.
- DPAC meets in-person & usually over Zoom in winter. DPAC's AGM in May.

TREASURER'S REPORT – GRACE CHAN, TREASURER

- Gave summary of last year's fundraising effort. We raised close to \$6,000. Based on May 10, 2023's AGM, funds were approved and allocated to various areas (such as Four-Year Technology Purchase Plan, Classroom / Teacher Support Fund, Literacy Materials and SLP Materials)
- Welcome BBQ brought in net profit of \$1,500
- October hot lunch had net profit of \$170
- Current bank account balance is \$13,000, mostly due to Munchalunch pre-sale of hot lunches throughout the year

- Grace put forward a motion to approve \$1,500 in reimbursement for Welcome BBQ spendings.
 - Kamilah seconded. All in favor.
- Grace put forward a 2nd motion to approve \$600 in payment to Little Caesars for October hot lunch.
 - Jennifer seconded. All in favor.
- Grace put forward a 3rd motion to approve \$250 in reimbursement to parents for October hot lunch add-ons.
 - Gem seconded. All in favor.
- We discussed the need for a Food Safe license whenever PAC is handling food. Grace
 put forward a 4th motion to approve \$264 in spending for 3 people to get food safe
 certification. Mark got his. Jennifer Gao might get one for PAC. Kamilah seconded. All in
 favor.
- Grace put forward a 5th motion to approve up to \$2,000 in spending on November and December hot lunch (including add-ons)
 - Mark seconded. All in favor.
- From May 10, 2023 AGM, PAC approved to allocate \$1,500 to Classroom/Teacher Fund. Atash put forward a motion to increase total allocation of Classroom/Teacher Fund by \$600 to \$2,100. (14 staff x \$150 per staff) Kamilah second. All in favor

HOT LUNCH DISCUSSION:

- Chris Chen raised the idea of a more frequent hot lunch at school. Parents like to see more frequent hot lunch offerings than once a month. Maybe for next year, we can look into hot lunch once every 2 weeks, or once every 3 weeks.
- The District lunch program is available on a more frequent basis. That's offered via the district. Not organized by PAC. School has details to be shared.

Atash put forward a motion to pay \$30 for today's babysitter.

Grace second. All in favor.

VARIOUS FUNDRAISING IDEAS WERE DISCUSSED:

- OCTOBER Movie night Friday. October 27, 2023. Door opens at 5:30pm. Movie starts at 6pm with a 10 mins break in between. Nothing over 70 mins long. Halloween theme. Need to be suitable for young kids too.
- DECEMBER Breakfast with Santa. Sherry volunteered to be leading this event. Planning for a Saturday in December. Could have a Wine draw (i.e. bring in a bottle of wine = 1 ticket. Winner takes all wine home). Could hire a professional photographer to take photos with Santa. Jennifer knows a photographer. Sherry might know one too.
- JUNE Grade 5 leaving ceremony. We have 15 Grade 5 students this year. Ning Ning volunteered to lead this event. Come up with ideas for activities for the graduation event (i.e. grade 5 field trip, dance party, etc.)
- Bidding for Parking spot. By donation? Highest bidder wins?
- Gala fundraising event. Formal dress up. Adults only.

OTHER ADMINISTRATIVE ISSUES WERE DISCUSSED:

- Parking at the school is challenging
- We need a second crosswalk near Strawline Hill. With overhead flashing lights. The library box is blocking kids' vision. Can it be relocated?
- Some parents would like to create a whatsapp group amongst the parents within each classroom.
- When a draft agenda is sent, parents who wish to amend the agenda can do so. That's why it's sent a week before the PAC meeting.
