n the **Department of Political Science**, students delve into complex political theories while developing keen critical thinking skills. Political Science major Helen Sofia Pahou experienced first-hand how applicable her education can be in any situation.

During her co-op term as a student analyst with the federal government, Helen used the theoretical knowledge she gained in POL 350: Public Policy for Women to assist a team of analysts in examining the impact of socioeconomic policies on marginalized communities.

"I was able to tie in a broad general knowledge of women's public policy into my co-op," says Helen. "It was great to learn from other analysts who were investigating the impact of socioeconomic policies on women."



At FASS, we are committed to helping students become engaged and informed citizens. Taya Wall, an International Studies student, already puts this commitment in practice. She makes a real-life social impact as a non-profit entrepreneur advocating for disenfranchised women in India, with the United Nations Academic Impact initiative awarding Taya a Millennium Fellowship in recognition of her community leadership and humanitarian work.

nspired by her experience as a varsity swimmer at SFU, Marina Cummiskey joined a research lab at the **Department of Psychology** to study the mental wellbeing of retiring athletes. This has set her on an exciting academic trajectory to pursue a master's degree in sport psychology at a top Canadian university.

A recipient of the FASS Dean's Undergraduate Convocation Medal, Marina's dedication to her community extends beyond her own student-athlete career. She strongly advocates for the mental health of student-athletes and hopes to use her academic research experience to help others as a sport psychologist.

# FASS RESEARCHER USES AI TO PRESERVE ENDANGERED INDIGENOUS LANGUAGES

Eldon Yellowhorn, a faculty member in SFU's **Department of Indigenous Studies**, applies computational science and artificial intelligence to Indigenous language revitalization.

Together with the Blackfoot and Cree Revitalization Project team, he developed an interactive online chatbot to teach and preserve endangered Indigenous languages.



riminology honours student Ashley Kyne champions Indigenous justice. Equipped with the legal reform theory and forensic knowledge taught at the **School of Criminology**, Ashley studies the overrepresentation of Indigenous people in the criminal justice system.

"I maintain an Indigenous lens to examine the criminal justice system," she says. "I want to use my knowledge to address the root causes to effect lasting change."



ara McGee added a **Global Asia** minor to her **Linguistics** degree to explore the variety of Asian cultures she grew up with in her East Vancouver neighbourhood. She says that taking language courses for the cultures she studied made understanding the terms easier, because it added a linguistic depth to her cultural understanding.

#### UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD AROUND US

Named one of Canada's top economists, **Economics** professor Krishna Pendakur conducts extensive research on systemic societal issues such as poverty, discrimination, and economic inequality.

In ECON 104, his students learn about policy-relevant issues in economics that impact our everyday life—from income inequality to carbon taxes to policy responses related to mental health and substance abuse.



mma Henderson's love of historical literature led her to explore several FASS programs throughout her degree. Now, she is an SFU graduate with a double major in **English** and **History**.

Her advice? "Explore different areas of study as much as you can. Take any courses that sound interesting and do not be afraid for your plan to change and develop as you go. It is your degree, so shape it how you want it to be."



The **Centre for Hellenic Studies** at the **Department of Global Humanities** launched a pilot program with the UCLA Center for the Study of Hellenic Culture to enable academic collaboration and travel between the two institutions.

The pilot program is made possible by the Stavros Niarchos Foundation, which also funds students and faculty to conduct hands-on research in Greece.

FASS is SFU's oldest, largest, and most diverse faculty and home to 30% of SFU's faculty and students. FASS researchers and students explore topics as diverse as foreign policy, women's writing, and sleep patterns in Vanuatu.

We build bridges from the academy to the community. We conduct respectful conversations that enable people to work together towards common goals.

Our work is interdisciplinary and we thrive in building connections that help citizens stay informed and better understand the human experience. o you want to write your own short story or publish a novel one day? The Department of English offers a Creative Writing minor to help you develop your own literary voice and publish your writing.

When Jarod Liebenberg independently published a children's story he wrote for a Creative Writing class assignment, it became an Amazon bestseller.

"I had never tried creative writing at that level before," he says. "If you have a good idea, you should try and produce it because there's always going to be someone that the idea touches."

WITH DATA ANALYSIS


