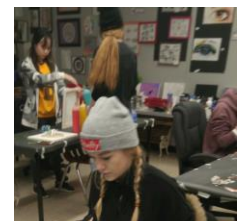

Students will need their Personal Education Number (PEN), which can be found on their report cards, to use this service. Provincial Numeracy Assessment: A graduation requirement

Wednesday **April 15th** is the LAST OPPORTUNITY this school year to write the Provincial Numeracy Assessment. Writing this assessment is a graduation requirement which some students may have fulfilled at a previous school. If a student is uncertain as to whether or not they have written the assessment in the past, they should check with one of our school counsellors.

It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they attend the scheduled session to complete this requirement. Sessions are scheduled by the provincial government and we cannot provide a make-up exam at CABE should a student not attend regardless of whatever individual circumstances may have arisen.

It is very important that students make sure that they have completed this requirement, or they will not be able to graduate in June.

New Grad Requirement: Career Life Connections 12

This year, the BC Ministry of Education introduced a new course which is a graduation requirement. Career Life Connections 12 (CLC12) is a course designed to identify and develop each student's personal interests, passions and goals. Students reflect on their learning experiences and competency development in school and community, as well as explore roles and possibilities in personal, education and work-life contexts. CLC12 is a 4-credit course with a percentage grade. Students will have to complete 30 volunteer/work hours, a mock job interview, a vision board and a culminating capstone project as part of their CLC12 requirements.
