Principal's Report

L. Birnie provided an update on what is happening at the school:

- Thanked the PAC for generosity and support over the last two years.

Fundraising Update

Notes from the Bring Your Own Device Information Night:

- School does not recommend any one device, but suggests that device should have a screen larger than 10' (recommended but not mandatory) and a keyboard (a nice to have) It is a tool so make sure that whatever brand you choose works with your home setup
- Students bring the device to the class each day, when not being used the devices are locked in a cupboard, at lunch and recess devices are locked in the cupboard
- Each day students take device home to be charged and return the next day
- In September, students are introduced to internet safety and the importance of being socially responsible online
- Filtering of inappropriate websites is done by the province, if a student tries to access something that is not an acceptable topic a red screen appears.
- Social Responsibility includes: Digital Citizenship (respecting others) online safety and screen time (screen time is not just the amount of time you spend in front of the screen but the difference between being engaged and learning, or being passive and unengaged)
- Devices would not be in constant use in the classroom, depends on what is being taught 2 focuses mentioned were group work for projects and writing process
- Using device for writing process advantages include editing without rewriting, students are able to develop writing skills faster, peer editing also encourages co-operative work and help student with spelling
- Eagle Mountain Middle is very technology based so having Aspenwood students be able to use devices in grade 4/5 prepares them for transition to Middle School
- Using devices in the classroom gives students the opportunity to research things in their own way at their own speed
- True depth of knowledge comes from a drive for deeper inquiry using technology gives students access to a global library that creates greater access to answers
- Aspenwood is currently testing online textbooks. This will be implemented in the future.
