PLAYGROUND DISCUSSION

• Terri B. described the current state of the playground (west of north grass field)

some pieces of equipment installed in the late 1980s

- · looking at replacement over the next five years and fundraising
- Brad Neufeld, business development manager of Habitat, spoke of his company's work on Tri-City and SD43 playgrounds

• once playground is approved by SD43, SD43 maintenance crews to remove the old equipment while Habitat supplies and installs the new pieces

• SD43 responsible for ongoing maintenance

 playground pieces are manufactured by Landscape Structures of Delano, MN

- replacement parts still available after 25 years
- push toward inclusive (not just accessible) components

• focus on sensory play: tactile, visual, auditory, vestibular, proprioception (awareness), motor planning and social/imaginative

• Brad measured playground footprint to see if two more components could be added to current inventory

south end proposal rejected

• west end proposal is for a circuit climber that could be phased in over future years

• PAC spoke about possibly extending playground footprint; dependent on costs

• Habitat has list of grant resources including Tire Stewardship BC and Kal Tire (for rubber surfacing)

• playground sub-committee to be formed in new year to look at timelines, budget and researching other sites
