Agenda and Minutes from previous meeting approved by Marit Heideman, seconded by Avita Sharma.

Principal's and vice-principal's report

- Slowly and cautiously opening up the school for more activities and utilization of indoor space. The 'vibe' in the school is changing positively due to these changes in covid regulations.
- Next year the school will have one extra division (1 extra English division). There is a lot of development in the school catchment.
- Principal Trask has completed school visits to 'Grade 5 –feeder' schools. There will be no open house for incoming students.
- Principal Trask will send out the school code of conduct for annual review.
- School goals the school has sent out a survey regarding the Indigenous learning goal. The school has already received responses, the survey will be open for a couple of weeks.
- Upcoming school activities:
 - o Pilates: June 8th
 - o Terry Fox run: April 26
 - School-wide Playland trip: June 22. Various middle schools have organized either a trip
 to Playland or Cultus Lake [prior to Covid]. Playland has been deemed the preferred trip
 as the travel time is much shorter, and thus provides for more 'play' time.
 - Staff appreciation and Grade 8 leaving ceremony are happening this year.
 - o Fly-over Canada field trip for EAL (English as an Additional Language) students
 - Various sports activities (e.g., rugby) are up and running
- Lockers for all students are starting up again.
- Quebec trip is on for 2023, and will include Grade 7 and 8 students. Will be organized in collaboration with Montgomery Middle School.
 - Q- Have there been parent chaperones on this trip in the past? There have been occasions in the past (e.g. teacher shortage, specials needs student)
- Pizza lunches can be organized again in the near future if so desired.
- Electronics recycling is happening again. Parents are requested to sign in to the school and can then drop off any used electronics.

Treasurer's Report

Account information as of March 31:

General Account: \$11,000
 Gaming account: \$6,000
 School-based account: \$16,469

- No significant activity in any of the accounts in the past months.
 - Request from school for \$1,500 for an Indigenous speaker still to come in.

- o Request for financial contribution for pilates instructor to be sent to the PAC.
- PAC will be able to contribute to staff appreciation lunch, Grade 8 leaving ceremony, and/or the school wish list.

PAC Activities

- Grade 8 leaving ceremony:
 - School district wants to be cautious and prefers not to have large (all Grade 8's + family) gatherings yet.
 - The school is suggested to split the ceremony into two (e.g., French/English, alphabetically, or by teams).
 - Parents feedback: alphabetically would split up friends.
 - A barbecue should be possible. A photo booth would be allowed too. A dance is not yet possible.
 - In 2019, the PAC spent \$1,600 and asked for a nominal student fee. The PAC has \$800 in the budget and can ask for a nominal fee for hamburgers etc. (~\$5).
 - o Claire Wheeler will co-ordinate the event and will ask for volunteers to help out.
- Staff appreciation:
 - Last year's budget was ~\$15 per staff member for a food truck.
 - o Q What would be the preferred option from the staff's perspective?
 - Staff loves both options, but for this year the food truck might be the better option with regard to health concerns.
 - The PAC can send out a request for donations to parents

New Business

- PAC Executive 2022-2023:
 - Current PAC members' terms are set to expire (i.e., Chair, Treasurer, Secretary). The PAC
 is looking for new members to fulfill a two-year term. Interested parents/guardians can
 contact the PAC for more information.
 - The school will send out an invite to incoming Grade 5 parents/guardians as well.
 - PAC AGM is scheduled for May 2022.
- Q regarding two items on School Cash Online:
 - o there is an item for 'Gauss Math', which is a math competition.
 - Another item is for 'Dunkin' Donuts or Krispy Cream'. This may be a fundraiser to help send kids to Playland.
- Q- Have there been any Covid cases at school? The school has no data on this as this data is confidential.
- Wish list from the school:
 - Tech Ed equipment needs updating (Table saw) ~\$2,000-\$4,000
 - \$100 class money
 - Special guest speakers
 - Yoga mats requested by 3 Teams

- Contribution toward an additional basketball court East of the current court ~\$40,000 (black top court) to \$60,000 (cement court).
- o Home Arts supplies (e.g., food processors, ironing boards, etc.)
 - Potentially donations of unused items from parents can be accepted (school will confirm).
