## About Dogs, Peanuts and Bad Weather

### Dogs:



We recognize that for many of our students, their pets are important members of the family and they enjoy having them accompany them on their walk to school. At the same time, we understand that other students are not comfortable around pets and have a fair amount of anxiety when they are near. With this in mind we ask that if you do have a pet walk with you to school please ensure that they are on a leash, and that they are under control at all times.

### Peanuts:

On behalf of the students in our school who are allergic to peanuts, we ask all families to be mindful of this as they choose their lunch menus and/or bring snacks or treats to the school. **It is especially important that families in Mr. Cummings, Mrs. Baruffa, Mrs. Rutherford, and Mr. Miyanaga/Mrs. Crawford's classes be careful not to send any foods containing peanuts with their children to school as they will be sharing spaces with students with severe peanut allergies.** These teachers have sent specific classroom procedures to the families in their rooms, please consult with your child's teacher if you have specific questions.
