

Before taking the program she was unsure if I was going to enjoy it and was unsure if she wanted to actually pursue Electrical as a career path. Ironically, Courtney's dad, mom and brother all became Electricians. **One could say that becoming an Electrician "was in her DNA".** Being a girl made Courtney a little unsure and hesitant about registering for the program. She was unsure if she would be comfortable, welcomed and able to do the job."




These fears and doubts were quickly shut out my her mom. An Electrician herself, Courtney's mom ensured her that she had everything it took to become an Electrician. She encouraged her to "go for it" and to "just give it try". This conversation pushed Courtney to take a leap of faith and apply for the program.

Quickly after starting the program, Courtney started to gain confidence in her skills and place in the Trade. She no longer doubted her abilities and was confident that she belonged in the program despite being a female. In particular, Courtney enjoyed performing hands-on work and completing group projects. The technical knowledge and confidence that she developed while in the program encouraged to apply for an apprenticeship position with Houle Electric, the same company that her Brother and Dad work for.

This programs students the opportunity to earn their Level 1 certification as a certified Electrician while in High School. This is a great opportunity for students who:

- Passion or interest for hands-on work
- Students who are creative and enjoy building projects
- Students who demonstrate strong skills in Math, Critical Thinking and Analytical Thinking
- Students who are focused and have a high degree of maturity and commitment
- Students who are able to multi-task
- Students who have an interest in the trade or learning more about the trade
- Students who are active and see themselves pursing a career where they are physically active each day.

DO YOU GET CREDITS FOR TAKING THIS PROGRAM?

Student who take the Level 1 Construction Electricians Program will receive16 credits for completing the program. Students will also receive credits with Camosun College as well as a certificate of completition.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

All of our programs are tuition free. Students will only be responsible for the cost of personal protective equipment and supplies. Total cost for this program is \$300.00. On average this saves students and families between \$3,500 and \$4,000.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF TAKING THIS PROGRAM IN HIGHSCHOOL?

Students who take this program while in High School have an opportunity to get a head start. Students will be able to complete their certification earlier, start their apprenticeship earlier and ultimately earn their Red Seal earlier. Students and families also save a significant amount in tuition fees by taking the program through SD43.


