#### DELO - Port Moody Graduate 2020

2019 Fire Academy Alumni

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When the war in Syria started Delo and his family found themselves living day-to-day fearing for their lives. It wasn't until after an explosion near his school which killed dozens of people and left blood running through the streets, that Delo and his family decided they needed to flee their home. This decision led Delo and his family on a 6-year long journey to Canada. In 2014 Delo and his family sought refuge at a camp in **Iraqi Kurdistan**. Delo and his family lived at this camp for 5 long years. Delo describes his time there as "very difficult" . One of the greatest difficulties for Delo was not being able to attend school. Delo says *"without school for 5 years I found myself living without any goals"*. Instead of planning for the future, Delo became consumed by just trying to survive.

Dreams and goals were drowned out by fear and anxiety. However, what Delo didn't know was that while living at the camp he would experience an event that would be life changing. This event would later inspire him to pursue a career path.

One day at the camp Delo noticed panic and commotion. He ran quickly to the people crowded around a tent and realized that a fire had broken out in engulfed it in flames. People scrambled to work together in efforts to put out the fire and save those who were trapped inside. Unfortunately those efforts fell short, and two young children died in the fire. In already difficult times, life grew increasingly more difficult. How could such a tragic event happen to people who had already ensured so much? This tragic and painful day made an everlasting impression on Delo and his community. In this moment, Delo wished so badly that he could to do something to help the families of the children who died, but he couldn't. He was helpless. This feeling inspired Delo to pursue a life where he was equipped to help others and protect his community. This pursuit would eventually lead him to the a career in Firefighting.

ith the help of relatives in Canada and their church, Delo got an opportunity that many others did not have. In 2019, Delo and his family were able to escape the refugee camp and immigrated to Canada. After arriving to Canada, Delo was placed at Port Moody Secondary and was instantly accepted into the school by friendly teachers, counselors and peers. It was here, at Port Moody, that he would discover the **SD43 Junior Fire Fighters Program**. After only a few months at the school Delos PE teacher recognized his character and eagerness to help others. It was these qualities that made Delo the perfect for the Firefighters Program. Delos teacher encouraged him to apply for the program and helped him prepare for the physical fitness test and personal interview. With this support, Delo was named one of ten students across the district who were selected for the 2019 Junior Firefighters Program.

During the 8-day program Delo met friends, learned about the educational and practical components of firefighting, repelled from the tops of buildings and got to use the jaws of life! This was an exhilarating and memorable 8-days for Delo and the other students in the program. In fact, Delo enjoyed the program so much that he did not want it to end! Delo enjoyed his experience in the Junior

"My ambition does not stop as time goes on, it grows " Firefighters program and is grateful for the experience he gained and the connections he made. Delo recommends this program to any student who is interested in pursuing a career in the field, or to anyone who enjoys working in a team environment and helping others. For Delo, the opportunity to participate in this program was a dream come true. This was a dream that was unimaginable only 2 short years ago when he was fighting for survival in the refugee camp. Delo wants to encourage students to take advantages of the opportunities they are available to them, **"they really don't know how lucky they are."**

## **WORK IN TRADES PROGRAM**

### WHAT IS WORK IN TRADES?

The WORK in Trades Program provides students ages 14 and older the opportunity to begin apprenticeship while in High School. Students who take this program have the opportunity to earn up to 16 high school credits towards graduation and also have the opportunity to earn a \$1000 award for working in a trade.

### WHAT ARE THE BENFITS?

This program gives students a head start on their career. Students are ale to earn valuable work experience, high school credits, start their apprenticeship and more!

### AM I ELIGIBLE FOR THE PROGRAM?

Students must meet the following criteria to be eligible for the WORK in Trades Program

- Students must be 14 years or older
- Students must have a Paid Job
- Students must be working in an apprenticable trade
