As you can see, lots going on and time is flying by. Hope everyone has a great month.



Two Key Indicators for Student Success in School

For some students, academic success comes naturally while for others it is a struggle. There have been copious studies trying to measure the elements of academic success. As you can image, the results have produced numerous theories and contributing factors. However, there have been some consistencies in the results of the research. These consistencies include attendance, both arriving on time and attending in general, and participation in extra-curricular activities enhances and improves student academic success.

Some might think that attendance is a "no-brainer". Obviously you need to attend to learn. The part of attendance people often overlook is arriving on time. When students are late, they enter class missing part of a lesson. It's like pulling out of your driveway right onto the highway. You can't get up to speed quick enough and you're constantly looking in the rear view mirror for information. This sets the tone for the day. Personally, I feel behind if I haven't been able to wrap my mind around the day before it starts. Arriving to school on time allows students to become mentally prepared for the day.

Participating in the school's extra-curricular events and programs is another way for student to be invested in school. Sports, clubs, and community programs provide students something exciting and engaging to look forward too. Central students are fortunate throughout the course of the year to have a multitude of possible activities in which to participate. I believe no other elementary school in the district offers the opportunities like Central. The staff provides numerous clubs and sports, currently in the 'track attack' season, while Heather Roemer plans and organizes community programs for after school. This all helps to engage students more fully in school which has a positive impact on their academics.

In the end, if you ensure that your child attends school regularly and arrives on time while participating in extra-curricular activities you will be helping your child toward greater academic success.
