Best Community We Need your Help!

As the holiday season approaches, we realize that many families in our own community are struggling to meet the increasing financial demands. Traditionally we organize a food drive to support the local Food Bank at SHARE Family & Community Services Society (SHARE). This year, they are respectfully asking us to consider raising funds rather than food. Below is some information.

Holiday food drives undoubtedly result in large quantities of food for SHARE's Food Bank.

Unfortunately, they also create some very real challenges, including:

- Large quantities of damaged and expired food being donated, that has to be sorted by SHARE staff and volunteers and then sent to landfill/compost/recycling.
- Significant drain on volunteer resources to handle the pickup, sorting and storage of the food items.
- Mismatch between the items most needed by those we serve (culturally specific items such as lentils and rice), and the items that are donated (e.g., Kraft dinner); and
- Large amounts of non-perishable and typically less nutritious food items being donated, versus SHARE's current focus of providing meat, milk, eggs, fruit, and vegetables to families visiting the Food Bank.

When SHARE receives monetary donations, they use those funds to buy items in bulk (thereby increasing the purchase power of every dollar donated) and to focus on what is most needed by those we serve every day – this means meal supplements for our seniors, fresh fruits and vegetables for our families, infant formula for our babies, and culturally appropriate items for everyone.

Anything you can do to support this important initiative for one of our main partners would be greatly appreciated. We will ask grade 11 and 12 students who are attending the **Winter Ball** to bring a loonie or twoonie to the Winter Ball. We will have leadership students collecting donations at the front of the school some mornings. We will also accept donations at the office, or through your School Cashonline account **until December 18th.** Please help us support our family hampers as well as a donation to our Local Food Bank.
