CAREER LIFE CONNECTIONS 12

Career Life Connections (also known as CLC) 12 is a year-round course that prepares our grade 12 students for success after high school. It is a mandatory course for graduation. Throughout the year, students complete a variety of assignments related to their personal, social, and educational experiences. The assignments help prepare them for their penultimate assignment, the Capstone Presentation, which is a celebration of their learning journeys. For the Capstone Presentations, students present about how far they have come on their educational journeys. (This year, students will be videotaping themselves and uploading their presentations to Microsoft Teams.) The Capstone Presentation is worth 40% of the total grade for CLC 12.

Students must also choose a mentor that they meet with three times during the school year. The mentor helps guide their student by discussing their goals and potential Capstone Project ideas with them. There is an assignment associated with the mentorship process that the student will complete on their own time.

CLC 12 is not a course that is taught in a classroom by any one teacher. This year, it will mainly be delivered online. All assignments are accessed through Microsoft Teams, where students can find assignment criteria, deadlines, and a place to submit their finished assignments. All work is done through Teams.

CLC is overseen by Vivienne Royle, Dylan Gant, Shannon Burnham and Bhashy Pather. They can be found in the Humanities Office in the library if students need any help during the CLC process. Their emails can also be found in the Staff Directory.
