BEEDIE LUMINARIES SCHOLARSHIPS

100+ scholarships are available for Canadian citizens or Permanent Residents (since 2020) with financial need who are in their final year of high school, entering into their first bachelor's degree, diploma, certificate or trades program at one of BC's public post-secondary institutions. Must have 75%+ average. Valued at up to \$11,000/ year for a bachelor's degree program, or a college university transfer program tenable for up to four years of funding; or for a college certificate/diploma or trades foundation programs, tenable for up to two years of funding. More info here. Deadline to apply is January 12, 2023, before 9 am.

JOHN EVANS ENGINEERING AWARD

Calling all female future engineers. \$5,000 and a potential summer engineering work placement with Fortis Inc. are available for a graduating student who self-identifies as female (Canadian or PR status) and will be entering an accredited Canadian Engineering program. Criteria are volunteer activities, leadership, and interpersonal skills. **Deadline is January 20, 2023.** More info here.

TEAL FOUNDATION – REFUGEE AWARDS

Three different awards are available to students who entered Canada as a refugee and have shown courage and determination while adapting to a new language and culture in Canada. Students must have studied English as an additional language since arriving in Canada and must be planning to pursue a vocational or academic program at a post-secondary institution in B.C. Award value is \$3,000.

Deadline to apply is January 31, 2023.

DAVID LAM ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS AWARD
