 - d. Click on the Assessment you wish to view to see your result.

We had two individuals and one relay team competing yesterday afternoon/evening at the BC High School Track & Field Championships.

In the Sr. Girls 400m, **Michela B.** CRUSHED her competition in winning Heat 2 in 58.87 seconds. She qualified for today's final. In the Jr. Girls 1500m, **Diana Z.** raced smartly and with a lot of guts but came up just short of qualifying for tomorrow's final. She did run a season's best time and will race again on Saturday in the 3000m. Our Sr. Girls 4x100m relay **(Kate P., Michela B., Delaney S., Makenna S.)** handily won their heat in a season's best time of 49.42 seconds. They will race in the final this afternoon.

Grade 12's must be passing CLC12 to pick up Cap/Gown on June 14th.

*UPDATED INFO - GRAD COMPASS CARD PASSES FOR PUBLIC TRANSIT

Grads can pick up 2 GradPass Compass cards for free rides on Translink Buses, SeaBuses, Skytrains or West Coast Express. Each pass is valid for one full day of unlimited travel.

Your Compass GradPass must be used in conjunction with your valid secondary school or government issued photo ID and is **valid from May 15-June 30.**
