#### **CAPSTONE PROPOSALS**

#### **LORAN SCHOLARSHIPS**

This four-year undergraduate merit award includes study at one of 25 Canadian universities, funding for summer work experiences, mentorship, and more. Up to 36 awards of up to \$100,000 each are available, plus another 124 smaller awards for finalist and Provincial Awards. Criteria: Min. average of 85%, graduating students who demonstrate character, service, and leadership potential. Canadian citizen or PR only.

#### **BCIT AIRCRAFT GAS TURBINE TECHNICIAN PROGRAM**

The Government of Canada is currently providing eligible domestic applicants with <u>tuition free education</u> for the Gas Turbine Technician program along with an industry partnership certificate and paid practicum. The program consists of 38 weeks of full-time studies. Approximately 40% of the day is spent on theory discussions in a classroom setting, followed by hands-on practical training in the shops and hangar.

# \*\*\*SLOW DOWN AND USE CAUTION IN THE DRIVEWAY/DROP OFF AREA IN FRONT OF THE SCHOOL\*\*\*

Students are reminded to slow down and use the designated crosswalk area when crossing through the school driveway area. Be very vigilant as drivers are often distracted as they are moving in and out of waiting spots. Also, our student drivers are reminded that the expectation is "dead slow" in our school driveways and parking lots.

# \*\*\*\*VAPING/SMOKING IS NOT PERMITTED IN THE SCHOOL OR ON SCHOOL GROUNDS\*\*\*\*

Vaporizers and/or e-cigarettes cannot be possessed at school under any circumstances.
