You will receive an email advising of exact pick up times closer to the date. **What?** <u>Bundle 1 = \$25</u> (3 lbs onions, 3 lbs carrots, 5 lbs red beets, 5 lbs pacific potatoes - small) <u>Bundle 2 = \$30</u> (0.5 lbs shallots , 1 lb parsnips , 5 lbs pacific potatoes - small, 5 lbs red beets)
