STEAM

The Great STEAM Earthquake Challenge

Our students are diving into an exciting and challenging competition that showcases their innovation, collaboration, and engineering prowess - The Great STEAM Earthquake Challenge!

The Challenge Overview:

In this unique competition, students form teams and are tasked with designing and constructing a structure capable of withstanding an earthquake simulation for a staggering 30 seconds, all while supporting the maximum amount of weight. The catch? Teams must carefully manage a budget, submit detailed plans to receive funds (in the form of Richter Bucks), and navigate the bureaucratic hurdles of building permits and inspections.

THE PROCESS

- 1. **Planning Phase:** Teams begin by drafting detailed blueprints of their earthquake-resistant structures. These plans must be submitted for approval to receive their allocated budget. This phase encourages students to think critically about design, materials, and construction methods.

- 5.**Testing Phase:** The ultimate test awaits as each structure faces a simulated earthquake, measuring its resilience and ability to support weight. The thrill of success and the lessons learned from any failures contribute to the overall educational experience.

JUDGING CRITERIA


The winning team will be determined based on a combination of factors:


- **Budget Management:** Teams that effectively allocate their funds will gain an advantage.






Your stuff misses you too
