Happy fall! September has sped past as usual in a blur of paperwork and online forms. Thanks to those parents who took the time to come out to our first PAC meeting. We hope to meet many more of you as the year progresses!

What is the Parent Advisory Council (PAC)?

The Parent Advisory Council (PAC) is an important venue for parents to be involved in their child's education. All parents and caregivers are welcome to attend meetings to hear about what's happening in the school, provide input, and participate in planning PAC activities.

Fundraising is an important part of our mandate. Last year we raised over \$5,400 for our school and donated \$2,150 to our teachers to purchase classroom supplies. Money raised over the years has bought a new sound system for our gym, smartboards, books for our library, and iPads for our classrooms.

Our most impressive feat was raising \$80,000 in 2014 (thanks in part to a Spirit Grant from the City of Coquitlam) to build the new blue and green playground at the lower end of the school. So many of the great things you see at our school come about through the hard work of parent volunteers and the generosity of our parent community.

We also sponsor events for the school such as the Saleema Noon body health workshop, Dance Week (kids are taught dance by a professional choreographer), author readings, musical and cultural performances, and more.

The PAC executive is elected every spring. Any parent or caregiver can run for an executive position. The first step is to come out to our meetings and learn what we're all about. This year our monthly meetings alternate between a Monday or a Wednesday evening. The principal is usually present at our meetings to give a report, so it's a great opportunity to hear about what's happening in the school.

Can't make it to meetings? No problem. Our agendas and meeting minutes are posted on the Eagle Ridge website, under the Parents tab. And you can still volunteer to help out at events and activities throughout the year. We'll send out volunteer requests throughout the year by email.

We currently need people to fill the following vacant positions:

DPAC Representative: This position involves attending a monthly meeting of the District Parent Advisory Committee (near Blue Mountain park) and reporting back to the PAC about what's going on in the district and to share ideas about what other schools are doing in terms of fundraising and community building.
