# Take Care of Yourself, Take Care of Each Other & Take Care of Glen

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The Fraser Institute's ranking of BC elementary schools will soon be released. I know many parents have questions about the ranking and how the rankings are made. The Fraser Institute ranking is based on the results of the Foundations Skills Assessment written in grade 4 and 7. The Foundation Skills Assessment is a standardized test that assesses students skills in reading, writing and numeracy.

The Fraser Institute's ranking is flawed as it does not include factors such as family income, parental educational attainment, percentage of EAL students, students with Special Needs or students in the care of the Ministry of Family and Children. Additionally, in Coquitlam, elementary rankings include the grade 7 FSA results even though those students are no longer part of the elementary school. This is because most districts have K-7 elementary schools.

According to Kevin Reimer, Past President of the British Columbia Principals and Vice- Principals Association, " to ranks schools on the basis of this single test is like ranking cities on the basis of the quality of their hockey team".

Knowing your local school matters, and determining if it is a good place for your child is something every parent should consider. Parents wanting to know their local schools can talk with teachers, administrators and parents in the school community. Glen welcomes parents and volunteers as important partners in the education and success of every learner. Our school culture including the extra curricular sports, after school programs and leadership opportunities communicates far more to parents than a flawed school ranking. Parents are encouraged to talk with either myself, Sarah Husband or Ray Appel to better understand the Fraser Institute.

### TRACK ATTACK AND TRACK AND FIELD

### **GRADE 3, 4 and 5 STUDENTS**

To prepare for the District Track and Field meet on May 26th at Coquitlam Town Centre, grade 3-5 students participate in Track Attack during the school day with their class.

Each class has four sessions in April to experience Track Attack. Grade 3's on Tuesdays and Grade 4/5's on Thursdays. Students are taught each of the events and given time to show what they can do. The 400, 800 and 1500 meters running events are not part of Track Attack.

During Track Attack teachers record student results of running events, shot put, discuss and long jump. Students who make or are close to the district standard during Track Attack, will be <u>invited</u> to join three weeks of additional Track and Field practice starting in May. A letter will be sent home with students who are being invited to participate which parents need to sign. Track practices will be either before school, lunch or after school.

Grade 3, 4 and 5 students will be invited to the 400 meter, 800 meter and 1500m practices in May based on their performance in Kilometer Club and Como Lake Relay. All students participate in Kilometer Club during class time. High Jump (grade 3-5) will be open to all students to attend practice for the first week in May.

Schools are only permitted to bring students to the district Track and Field meet who have reached the district standards. This requirement is to make sure that students have a positive and safe experience while competing against other schools. See page 3 of this newsletter for the NEW district standards.

### Changes to the District Track and Field Meet

- There will **NO LONGER** be a 4 x 200 relay for grade 3 or 4.
- The 800 m now includes grade 3 runners ( 2 runner per gender per grade).
- Students may only go in one relay, either the 4 x 100 or the medley not both. Each school may only enter one 4 x 100 and one medley team. (Not an A & B team)

# Como Lake Relays Grade 4 and 5

Grade 4 and 5 students are practicing three times a week to prepare for the Como Lake Relays on Thursday, April 20th . Most elementary schools in Coquitlam include a team. Students run in teams of 4 with **each** team member running one lap of Como Lake (1.2km).

Nearly 40 students signed up and are trained 3 days each week. Runners will be selected based on their time, attendance and must be able to run the entire distance without walking. Congratulations to all the students who have been training and improving their fitness.
