Dear Parents/Guardians,

There has never been such an exciting and innovative time in education. The B.C. public education system is already a world class system. The K-12 revised curriculum promises to help secure BC as a world leader.

The K-9 revisions in curriculum include a significant emphasis on the use of inquiry and more flexibility for students to show their learning in many ways. The basic competencies of reading, writing and mathematics remain but with a focus on understanding concepts through hands on experiences. An emphasis on the Aboriginal principles of learning as well as building a better understanding of the history of first peoples has been included in all subject areas in all grades. Parents are encouraged to learn too. Please explore the work of Gord Downie who has produced an album, animated film and graphic novel to honour the life of Chanie Wenjack who died after he walked away from the residential school he was forced to attend in 1966. Woven throughout all curriculum areas are 3 core competencies, Communication, Thinking, and Personal and Social Responsibility. Core competencies are intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need to develop in order to engage in deep and life-long learning. The Zones of Regulation is one example of how we are developing personal and social responsibility with your children.

Changes in learning need to be reflected in how we communicate learning to parents. This year the Coquitlam School District and the province are inviting parents to give their input regarding reporting students learning. In the 2017/18 school year the Ministry of Education will announce a new reporting policy based on parent input and educational research. Attached is the public consultation meeting they are hosting. REPORT CARDS

Please take some time to read the report card with your child. Ask them to think about their learning this term. Here are some questions to guide your conversation:



What are they proud of or happy about? What makes them feel good about that one thing? What is one thing they would like to get better at? How could they get better at it? What are one or two specific things they are going to do to reach their goal?

Work to set one or two goals that are within your child's reach. We are all able to make small changes but rarely do we successfully make big ones that last. Many small successful changes can add up over time to a very significant change.

Dressing for the Weather



Students will go outside at recess and lunch <u>almost</u> everyday even when it is raining.

Students need to bring umbrellas, water proof rain coats and rain boots to school on rainy or cold days.....even if there is the chance of rain. Please make sure that your child is dressed for the rainy B.C. weather.



Kindergarten to grade 3 children need to have extra clothes at school that can be kept in their cloakroom space in case they get wet. Small children love to play in puddles and sometimes get very wet. We do not want children in wet clothes all day at school. It is cold and uncomfortable for your child. Children also need active play to be able to learn well.

WINTER WEATHER AND SCHOOL CLOSURES

Schools are not usually closed because of snow or other weather conditions. All schools in the Coquitlam School District will remain open, if possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

Our schools are in very different climate zones from one an-

other and there may be the need for **some** schools to be closed within the district while other remain open. If there is a partial closure of schools within the school district, these individual schools will be named. Full or partial school closures do not happen often.
