
COMPARE AND CONTRAST ESSAY

Expository Essay Review

- 5 paragraphs: introduction, 3 body paragraphs, conclusion
- Thesis statement: contains your argument and 3 points

Structure of Expository Essay



- 1. Introduction
- 2. First Body Paragraph
- 3. Second Body Paragraph
- 4. Third Body Paragraph
- 5. Conclusion

TOTAL= 5 PARAGRAPHS

Compare and Contrast Essay

- Also called a synthesis essay it makes connections across at least 2 texts
- Terminology:
 - "compare" look at similarities
 - "contrast" look at differences
 - "compare and contrast" look at similarities and/or differences. You must write about <u>both</u> texts in order to fulfill the requirements.

Methods/Structures

Block method

Similarities-to-differences method

- Point-by-point method
 - You should be comfortable using the point-by-point method by English 11 and English 12

Subjects and Points

- Subjects the two texts or topics that are the subject of your essay. They are what you are comparing and contrasting. These will be given to you in the essay prompt.
 - Ex. "Compare and contrast the Harry Potter books to the Harry Potter movies."

- Points of comparison/contrast the specific ways in which the subjects are similar or different. You will have to determine these yourself.
 - Ex. The books and movies are similar and different in terms of character, setting, and plot.

Block Structure

two body paragraphs: one for each subject

Introduction Point #1 (character) Subject 1 Point #2 (setting) (HP books) Point #3 (plot) Point #1 (character) Subject 2 Point #2 (setting) (HP movies) Point #3 (plot) Conclusion

two body paragraphs: one for similarities and one for differences

Conclusion

Point-by-Point Structure

Introduction

Point #1 (character)

- Subject 1 (HP books)
- Subject 2 (HP movies)

Point #2 (setting)

- Subject 1 (HP books)
- Subject 2 (HP movies)

Point #3 (plot)

- Subject 1 (HP books)
- Subject 2 (HP movies)

Conclusion

Do not change the order here!

Compare and Contrast Essay: Summary

■ The compare and contrast essay is a type of expository essay. It is also called a synthesis essay because you synthesize information from two or more sources.

You must discuss both texts and relate them to one another.
Do not write about them in isolation!

■ Practice: Compare and contrast the benefits/drawbacks of eating fast food versus eating home-cooked meals.

Writing a Compare and Contrast Essay

Step 1. Brainstorm.

Step 2. Find points of comparison/points of contrast.

Step 3. Pick a structure and organize your information.

Step 4. Write your thesis statement.

Step 5. Write your essay.

Your Thesis Statement

- Your thesis statement for a compare and contrast essay must still be specific!
- **Weak**: The Harry Potter books and movies have many similarities and differences.
 - Everything is similar and different in many ways! This thesis statement tells us nothing.
- **Better**: The Harry Potter books and movies show similarities in terms of plot and setting but are different in their depictions of some characters.
