UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO - NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Value: The National Scholarship covers tuition, incidental and residence fees for up to four years of study. Finalists not designated as National Scholars receive Arbor Scholarships at a value of \$7,500 in the first year and \$1,500 per year for three additional years of undergraduate study. The scholarship is tenable only at the University of Toronto.

Deadline: October 20, 2022

The National Scholarship recognizes original and creative thinkers, community leaders, and high academic achievers. It is U of T's most prestigious award for Canadian high school students entering the university.

Eligibility:

- an original and creative thinker
- committed to school and community
- a high achiever in academic and creative pursuits
- enthusiastic about learning and intellectual exploration
