GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS--CONT'D

- ▶ ELECTIVE COURSES - Total 28 credits for Grade 10 - 12 elective courses
- ▶ Overall total is 80 credits
- ▶ Of the 80 credits for graduation, at least 16 credits must be at the Grade 12 level, including English Studies 12
- ▶ Numeracy Assessment (done in Grade 10 for most students)
- ▶ Literacy 10 Assessment does not apply to this year's graduating class
- ▶ Literacy 12 Assessment has been postponed and will not happen for this year's Grade 12 students

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- ▶ Remember, this is a mandatory course for graduation! Everything is done on Teams
 - ▶ Six assignments with specific due dates between now and January (December for the early grad students)
 - ▶ Capstone Project will be presented after Spring Break; details will come later
 - ▶ You have all had your first meeting by now with your assigned CLC mentor and know the details. If you missed the meeting, contact your CLC mentor right away
 - ▶ First assignment is due Friday, October 15th and the second assignment is due just two weeks after that!

POST-SECONDARY REQUIREMENTS

- ▶ Entrance requirements differ for each post-secondary institution.
- ▶ Check post-secondary institutions' websites.
- ▶ Entrance requirements change over time.
- ▶ Most post-secondary institutions are also looking at Grade 11 final marks and a personal portfolio.

Look for:

- ▶ date applications open - some are already open!
- ▶ deadlines for applications.
- ▶ admission requirements - for specific institutions as well as faculties within those institutions.
- ▶ deadline for completion of online courses.

STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE

- ▶ When you apply to a Post-Secondary Institution (PSI), they need to see your transcript (a record of Grade 10 -12 courses with final or interim grades, and the courses you are scheduled to take later this year)
- ▶ You can electronically send your transcript to each PSI you are applying to, through the Student Transcript Service (STS) at www.studenttranscripts.gov.bc.ca
- ▶ You can authorize ongoing access for your PSI selections to receive transcript updates throughout the year

STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE—CONT'D

- ▶ Go to this [STS](#) website and follow the prompts.
- ▶ You will first create a BCeID using your PEN (9-digit Provincial Education Number, found on your report card)
- ▶ Then you use the BCeID log into the STS account, where you can view your transcript
- ▶ If you need assistance, view these [Help Videos](#) for more explanations of how to set up your account and how to order and send transcripts

STUDENT TRANSCRIPT SERVICE—CONT'D

- ▶ You can download the transcript for yourself to review it
- ▶ You are responsible for ensuring transcript accuracy before sending it a PSI so review the transcript carefully to ensure everything is there. If you think there is an error, email your counsellor right away.
- ▶ Enter your PSI selections in the Student Transcript Service portal by **NOVEMBER 30!** You can always go back to it later to add or delete a PSI from your cart as needed.

POST-SECONDARY TIPS

- ▶ Make sure to obtain all the information needed to apply to the PSI of your choice - it is different for each PSI
- ▶ Apply to several PSIs, not just the one place you want the most
- ▶ If you get stuck or have difficulty, Ms. Chau (our Post-Secondary & Career Advisor) is an excellent resource.
- ▶ If you are very set on a particular course of study, be sure to apply for programs at several different PSIs AND explore transfer programs (e.g., Capilano University's Engineering Transition Diploma, the University Transfer Program at Coquitlam College, Douglas College, etc.).

POST-SECONDARY TIPS—CONT'D

- ▶ If you are doing any **online courses**, be aware that PSIs have different completion deadlines. For example, SFU requires on-line courses to be completed by **January 31**
- ▶ It is **YOUR** responsibility to check admissions and faculty requirements.
- ▶ Be aware of deadlines!
- ▶ Last tip....Faculty of Arts does not mean visual art classes! These are various majors under the Humanities umbrella. Check the details on each PSI website! There are a LOT of choices to explore!

AWARDS CEREMONY

- ▶ Details for the Awards Ceremony are still being finalized. We will provide you with this information as soon as it is available.

VALEDICTORIAN

- ▶ A Grade 12 student is chosen from the graduation class of their peers. The chosen student prepares a speech that is given to the graduating class at the commencement ceremony.

- ▶ The following criteria determine a Grade 12 student's eligibility for participation in the choosing of the valedictorian:
 1. Be in graduating position at the time of valedictorian nomination
 2. Be in good standing with respect to school citizenship
 3. Be in good standing with respect to achievement, in both curricular and extra-curricular areas
 4. Be in good standing with respect to work habits
 5. Have 10 student nominations and 2 teacher signatures

VALEDICTORIAN SELECTION

- ▶ Valedictorian nomination forms become available in April
- ▶ Valedictorian nomination forms due about a week later
- ▶ Successful candidates will be notified by Ms. Butterfield and given instructions for their one-minute 'sample' speech
- ▶ Valedictorian Speeches are shared with the Grade 12 class in May and Grade 12 students assess each speech with a rubric
- ▶ The chosen Valedictorian then prepares their full Valedictorian speech (three to four minutes long) for the Commencement Ceremony

Exact dates will be announced later in the school year
