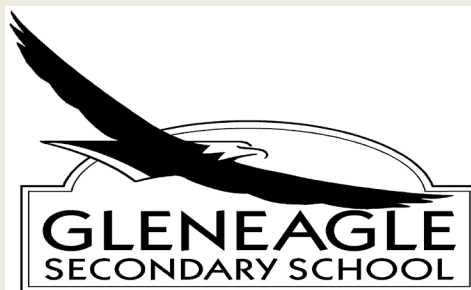
### **CAREER RESOURCES**

Courses are tuition free for BC residents. A \$100 textbook deposit is charged upon registration for courses that use textbooks. International students will be charged tuition after registering.



**Remedial - Grades 9 &10**

Courses provide a path for students who achieved 40-49% in a course to attain a 50% passing grade. Grade 9 & 10 remedial courses only. All Remedial courses include teaching of organizational and study skills.

**Courses:** Grades 9 & 10 courses in English, Math, Science & Social studies. Centennial Secondary only. Remedial courses are by referral open, not open for public registration. Referral forms available starting in April.
