- **Wednesday, June 26th – Special Grade 5 Leaving Ceremony at 1:00 p.m.** We hope that you will be able to join us!!

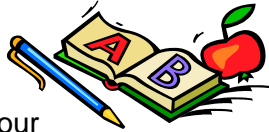

The school will be closed on Monday, June 3rd so that the teachers can attend professional development workshops. Students **do not** attend school on this day.

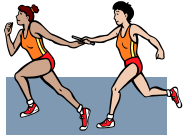
Moving/Kindergarten Registration

Traffic Safety:

The safety of our children is a top priority. We would like to remind drivers that we have many children that walk to school on a daily basis using the crosswalks to get to school. Please take time to **SLOW DOWN IN SCHOOL ZONES AND STOP AT CROSSWALKS** to allow children to arrive at school safely.

Traffic & Parking At Hazel Trembath:

Thank you to parents for respecting the no stopping area in front of the school. The front of the school drop off is only for those individuals who have specific physical needs. The expectation is that all families drop off children at the upper parking lots and continue down the stairs to the school. Cars entering the upper parking lot are asked to take a large sweep to the right as they are entering and stay tight to the right when exiting the parking lot. On high volume days it is imperative that parents proceed with extra caution. Please review safety expectations with your children if they are walking to school as well. The care for our children is a collective responsibility.

DROP OFF REQUEST – Early Morning

Teachers are extremely busy in the morning preparing and planning for the day's lesson. Prior to 8:25 a.m., we cannot provide adequate supervision of our students on the playground. School doors do not open for students until 8:40 a.m., however, we will have some supervision after 8:25 in designated areas. Parents are encouraged to supervise their children until the 8:40 bell and to help establish socially responsible expectations when waiting to come in to school each day and after school before going home. As a community we are all responsible for the well being of our children. Thank you.



Student Absences:

For the safety of all students we request that you call the school before 8:50 a.m. and either relay the information to Mrs. Bolzan or leave a message on the answering machine with any student absences, whether it be for the entire day, half a day or to report that the student will be late. Please remind your child that they are to check in at the office when they arrive late. If a student is marked absent, it is our procedure to call the parent at home first, then at work and then to call the emergency contact to ensure the safety of the student. This is a necessary, but very time consuming process, so your help in this matter is very much appreciated.

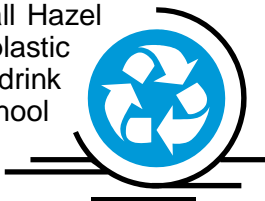

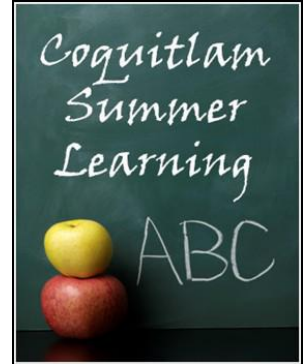

Vandal Watch

YOU CAN HELP LOOK AFTER OUR SCHOOL AND STOP VANDALISM!

Our school is an important place in our neighbourhood and we all want to do everything we can to eliminate vandalism on our school grounds. Schools are most at risk on weekend evenings when the weather is good. You can help stop the problem.

Be Vigilant

Keep your eyes and ears open for suspicious activities. Signs of trouble include late night trespassers and the gathering of unorganized groups of people. Much vandalism takes place on Friday and Saturday between 11 p.m. – 2 a.m.

Gather Information

Everything you see and hear helps. Note the physical characteristics and clothing of individuals. If you see automobiles, jot down license plate numbers.

Your Call is Anonymous and Confidential

No one will ask for your name or phone number. The Tip Line is available 24 hours a day. Security personnel will investigate and will take action or involve the police. **Do not get involved in a confrontation yourself.**

KEEP THE TIP LINE PHONE NUMBER HANDY. MAKE SURE THE PHONE NUMBER IS GIVEN ONLY TO RESPONSIBLE ADULTS.



May is Speech and Hearing Awareness Month

Did you know?

- ✓ Did you know that delayed speech development is one of the most common symptoms of developmental delay in children? It occurs in 5-10% of all children.
- ✓ Did you know that there are many factors that contribute to or cause communication disorders or deficits? A hearing loss, illness, injury, and congenital or psychological conditions are just some examples of such contributing factors.
- ✓ Did you know the impairments that a Speech Language Pathologist can treat include voice, fluency, language and articulation disorders?

Some information you should know, but might not want to 'hear':

- ✓ As many as three out of four children experience otitis media, inflammation of the middle ear, by the time they are three years old.
- ✓ Ear infections are the most common illnesses in babies and young children.
- ✓ Noise-induced hearing loss (NIHL) is when an individual is exposed to sounds that are too loud for prolonged time periods and, as a result, the delicate inner ear parts are injured. Approximately one third of those Americans with hearing loss can identify 'noise pollution' as one of the contributing factors. Avoid loud noises when possible. If loud noise exposure is inevitable (concerts, lawn mowers, firecrackers, etc.) then wear protection (ear plugs).
- ✓ Ear wax is produced by special glands in the skin of the outer ear which helps to protect the ear from outside invaders. Often, a buildup of ear wax is caused by the use of cotton swabs or other objects which push the wax deeper into the canal. For the most part, ears are self-cleaning mechanisms. It is best to clean the ears with a wet wash cloth on the outside surface only, and avoid going deeper into the ear canal. Consult with a doctor or audiologist if concerns about ear wax or ear infections are present.

"Hear Ye, Hear Ye! The moral of this lesson is, and don't let it be forgotten; use ear plugs to guard against loudness and avoid the swabs made of cotton!"

Did you know that 'dysfluencies' are quite common during normal speech production? It is only when these 'dysfluencies' occur greater than 8-10% of the time that the speaker is considered to be a person who stutters (or a person who demonstrates 'dysfluencies'). There are many famous faces in Hollywood who have been diagnosed as a person who stutters. Can you name any? Check with a Speech Language Pathologist or go online to such websites as www.stutteringhelp.org or www.mnsu.edu to see if any of your guesses are correct.

Below are some fluency enhancing techniques that Speech Language Pathologists use in therapy:

- Slow, steady speech
- Light articulatory contact
- Focusing on pausing and phrasing
- Releasing tension in speech muscles
- Easy onset of speech
