Why It Matters? The Murals

The recent graffiti on one of our murals generated a lot of interest and evoked a reaction at our school community but also local news organizations.

It's not often that I get calls from reports from The Now News and News1130 Radio.

Sadly, our school is regularly tagged with graffiti, but it is usually the walls and doors.

On February 7th, one of our murals was tagged.

On the morning of February 8th, several children came into the office to tell us that there was graffiti on one of the murals. Parents and students took notice of the defaced mural over the course of the day and let us know they were upset.

Why did the graffiti on one of our murals generate a reaction, when the other graffiti around the school do not? To me, it felt like an attack on the collaborative work and values of our school.

The Outdoor Art Mural pro-

effort led by Ms. Ewart, Mrs. Liski and the Grade Four students to beautify the retaining wall. Working with artist Tammy Pilon, they created twelve amazing murals showcasing Port Moody. We generated a lot of interest when we tackled the project that led to donations and an appearance on CityTV last Spring and a formal unveiling ceremony in June. The community valued the murals because of the collaboration and good will involved.

For nine months, the murals remained untouched, despite graffiti appearing in other parts of our school. It is disheartening to see our murals defaced.

In some ways, I'm thankful that our murals have generated this much attention as it shows that we really do care about our school and value the work of students, staff and parents.

I hope this does not happen again.

There will not be a drop-in registration session.

Registration will be done on line with credit card, pay pal or cheques. Those families paying by cheque can make it payable to "Port Moody Minor Lacrosse Association". Families utilizing KidSport please e-mail the registrar. Registration of these players will be by the hard copy registration form method.

A player is not registered until a completed registration form is received and payment is received in full.

Registrants must fill-in all names, addresses, phone numbers (including cellular phone numbers) and e-mail addresses of all parents/guardians so that we can compile a comprehensive list of PMLA members and so that we can send out important notices as they arise.

New players will need to scan a copy of their birth certificate or passport, BC Care Card and proof of Port Moody residency in the prescribed format as defined by the BCLA (property tax bill, hydro/electricity bill, gas bill or cable/satellite bill) to registrar@portmoodylacrosse.org or drop off to 112 Clearview Drive, Port Moody, BC V3H2S8.

Players in each division will be entered on a wait list in the sequence of registration. When enough players in a division register to create a team, a new waiting list will be formed in hopes that enough players register to complete another team. If multiple teams are formed in a division the final team composition may be determined through tryouts.

In addition to registration fees collected by the association, the team manager will be responsible for collecting 75\$ jersey deposit cheques postdated to August 1, 2013 along with team fees to pay for tournaments and other team events to be collected by the team manager.

It was when I put my hockey equipment away and I was absolutely ecstatic to see the end of the hockey season. One of the worst things to happen to the game, in my opinion, has been year-round hockey and, in particular, summer hockey. All it does for kids, as far as I can tell, is keep them out of sports they should be doing in the warmer weather. I could hardly wait to get my lacrosse stick out and start throwing the ball against the walls and working on our moves as we played the lacrosse equivalent to road hockey. All the good hockey players seemed to play lacrosse in those days and

every one of them learned something from the game to carry over to the other – things athletes can only learn by mixing up the games they play when they are young."
