CAREER CENTER



We will have a Canadian Coast Guard College Recruitment Officer at Heritage Woods on January 14th at lunch in the Grand Hall to discuss with students the post-secondary opportunities available.

The Canadian Coast Guard Officer Training Program offers high school graduates a post secondary education in two streams: Marine Engineering or Marine Navigation. As a result of our four year program, the Officer Cadets will obtain the following:

- Bachelor of Technology in Nautical Sciences
- Canadian Coast Guard College Diploma
- Commercial Certification issued by Transport Canada
- Guaranteed employment with the Canadian Coast Guard upon graduation

Joining the Canadian Coast Guard Officer Training Program, Officer Cadets will receive throughout the four year training program:

- a tuition free education
- a monthly allowance,
- free room and board, textbooks and uniforms etc.

Those who join the Officer Training Program become a government employee from the first day of the Officer training program and their job title is Officer Cadet. They will receive:

- medical and dental plan coverage,
- pensionable service
- 4 weeks of paid vacation per year

High school students can apply to the Officer Training program in their grade 12 year.


