

This course introduces students to the methods, materials and concepts of drawing, both as a visual language and as at coll for enhancing perceptual awareness. While investigating process and developing a critical vocabulary, students will begin to acquire the skills to translate immediate observation and ideas into 2-dimensional form. In-class projects and assignments will encompass various aspects of drawing, while visual presentations and class discussion will introduce students to contemporary and historical ideas of art and design.



ACADEMIC ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

This is a university level course. Students are expected to meet Emily Carr University academic admission requirements

- English 11 or 12 (minimum C grade in most recent)
- PLUS two other Grade 11 or 12 academic courses
- PLUS two Grade 11 or 12 electives (Visual Art 11 or 12 recommended)
- Total overall grade point average in all subjects of 2.5 (C+ or 67%)

Applicants must provide Diploma Verification as confirmation that they are going to meet academic admission requirements

Note Students may apply having only completed English 12 however, English 12 and Grade 12 academic and elective classes are the final requirement for future admission to Emily Carr University.

Qualified applicants will be admitted on a first-applied basis (date of submission to your high school counsellor's office). Space is limited to 20 seats.

TUITION FEES

Upon acceptance to the program, students are responsible for the full amount of tuition. Domestic \$460.00 (includes supply kit) International \$1,664.00 (includes supply kit)
