
WHAT IS SOYL?

This course introduces students to the methods, materials and concepts of drawing, both as a visual language and as at coll for enhancing perceptual awareness. Note Students may apply having only completed English 12 however, English 12 and Grade 12 academic and elective classes are the final requirement for future admission to Emily Carr University.

Qualified applicants will be admitted on a first-applied basis (date of submission to your high school counsellor's office). Space is limited to 20 seats.
