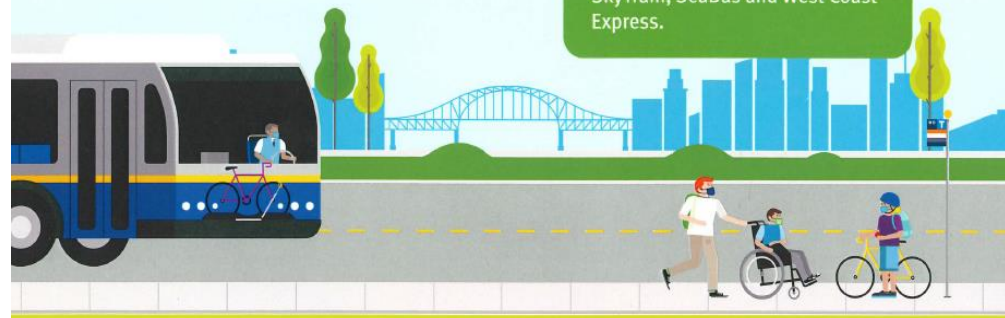

Secondary Academic Completion (formerly known as "Remedial")

July 13 to 30, 8:30-11:30AM or 12:00-3:00PM Daily

Locations: Gleneagle

Courses: Grades 9 & 10 English, Math, Science & Social studies.

These courses provide a path for students who achieved 40-49% in a course (during this 2020-2021 school year) to attain a passing grade. Students will be able to upgrade their mark to 50% (C-).

These courses will follow a hybrid format: Students will attend in-person for a Face-to-Face class once a week (either Thursday or Friday; you will be notified before the course starts as to which day you are to attend) and will attend online scheduled classes the other days.

Registration for Remedial courses is by referral only, see website or your high school counsellor for details. Referrals will be accepted until June 25. The referral form will collect some brief information from your teacher so we can customize your course to what you need to complete.

July 6 to August 11. Morning and Afternoon Courses available.

Locations: Gleneagle

Courses: Biology 11/12; Career Life Education 10; Chemistry 11/12; English 10,11,12; EAL 10/11*; Mathematics 10,11; Physics 11,12; PE 10; Science 10; Social Studies 10/11.

International students are not eligible for Fast Track courses (contact the International Ed department for summer course options).

Fast Track courses this summer will follow a hybrid format:

- Two weekly synchronous (online) class sessions
- One weekly in-person Face-to-Face class session on the weeks of July 12, 19, 26 and Aug. 2: All students must attend these Face-to-Face class sessions, which will include assessments/quizzes etc. Each student will be notified, in advance of the course start-up, as to which of these in-person days they will be required to attend.
- Online work & online tutorial support

This program is best suited for students wishing to complete the selected course within a 6 week timeline.

Future Heroes Bursary Program will inspire and support the next generation in their ambition of having a career in healthcare.

For the 2021/2022 academic year, one hundred and twenty five (125) entrance bursaries will be available to students entering into their first year of a first degree, be it a bachelor, diploma, or certificate, at an eligible institution, in an eligible program. 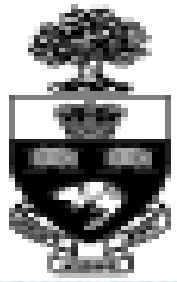
• **To be eligible, applicants must:**

- Be entering into full-time studies in the **first year of a first degree**, be it a bachelor, diploma or certificate in the 2021/2022 academic year. Students who have already studied at the post-secondary level are not eligible*;
- Be attending an eligible institution, as identified on the program guidelines
- Be enrolled in an eligible program, as identified on the program guidelines (there are a LOT of eligible programs)
- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident;
- Have a minimum cumulative average of 70% (or equivalent) over the last 3 terms of available marks**. Non-academic courses such as career or personal development related courses will not be considered.

Rotman Commerce UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO

- We're delighted to invite your school to participate in The Boardroom, Rotman Commerce's High School Business Case Competition. Open to students in grades 9 through 11, the Boardroom is a team-based competition that challenges participants to work together on a business idea. Each team will be comprised of four individuals and can be a mix of students from different grades but all must be from the same school. No prior business knowledge or experience is required.

This year, we are offering over \$1,000 in prizes to teams who use teamwork, creativity, and analytical skills to propose a solution to key challenges in an area of business. There are two rounds of competition. Finalists of the first written round will be invited to compete in the final two presentation rounds online in October. The finalists will present to The Boardroom – a panel of judges – and have the opportunity to learn from highly regarded business professionals.

- **This year's case is accessible upon each team's registration. Students will have until May 31, 2021 to register and submit their proposals. We will not accept additional registrations or submissions after this deadline.**

Twelve teams will be invited to compete round 2, which will be held virtually on Saturday, October 16, 2021. Finalists will present to our alumni judges over video conference. All finalists will receive certificates of recognition and a chance to speak with current students, alumni and industry professionals.

The top three teams will receive gift cards and special certificates of excellence. Each member of the first-place team will be eligible for a \$2,500 award toward first-year Rotman Commerce tuition. To claim the award, students must receive and accept an offer of admission from Rotman Commerce and register in our program once they are eligible for university.

We strongly encourage students to form teams with a variety of strengths and perspectives, as our judges value diligent problem-solving with original thinking and innovative solutions. - The Interior Design Department at BCIT offers an Interior Design Fundamentals **Certificate**, Kitchen and Bath Design **Associate Certificate** (NKBA Certified), Residential Interiors **Diploma**, Interior Design **Diploma**, and a CIDA accredited **Bachelor of Interior Design**. All Interior Design Programs start with the Interior Design Fundamentals Certificate (Year 1).
- The Interior Design Fundamentals Certificate program is offered in both a part-time and full-time format. Get a head start at university with the UBC Future Global Leaders program

Are you looking to challenge yourself academically, or boost yourself towards your academic goals? The [UBC Future Global Leaders](#) program is designed for you. For three weeks, learn from top UBC professors as you delve deeper into your academic interests, and discover what teaching is like at the first-year level at a top-tier university. It's a great way to figure out what your passions are while you're still in high school, and prepare yourself for success at university and beyond.

What can you study?

- You can choose from seven engaging academic courses, all taught by UBC instructors. This year, you'll take your courses online. You'll have the chance to meet other students from around the world as you attend your live virtual classes from Monday to Friday.

Who can take part?

- To register for a UBC Future Global Leaders course, you must be 15 to 18 years old and have completed Grade 10 or equivalent. We suggest that you have a grade point average of 78% or letter grade B or higher, or a minimum IB final grade of 5. You don't need to submit any transcripts to register.
- If you want to register for an academic course and English is not your first language, we recommend an IELTS (International English Language Testing System) score of 6.0 or equivalent, or TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) Internet-based score of 80 or equivalent. You don't need to provide your scores, and can self-assess your own levels.

Health Care Access Program: Job Opportunity after graduation

COVID-19 has increased the need for additional staff in long-term care and assisted living services. Typically, these positions require prior experience and education. The Health Career Access Program provides a path for applicants with no health care experience to get hired and receive on-the-job training.

How to get your career started

- COVID-19 has increased the need for health care assistants in long-term care and assisted living services.
- Normally, to become a health care assistant, you must complete six to eight months of post-secondary education at your own expense before you can apply for a position.
- Through the Health Career Access Program, the Province will pay for your post-secondary education.

New hires in the program start in a health care support worker position and receive paid training that leads to full qualification as a health care assistant.

Please note: All successful program applicants must start as a health care support worker before advancing to a health care assistant position.

Health care support worker

- Health care support workers are supervised by registered nurses or other regulated health care professionals. They provide a variety of critical non-clinical, non-direct care supports to patients and residents.
- Typical duties include:
 - Participating as an integral member of a healthcare delivery team
 - Establishing a caring relationship with clients, residents and families
 - Providing support and assistance with mealtime activities

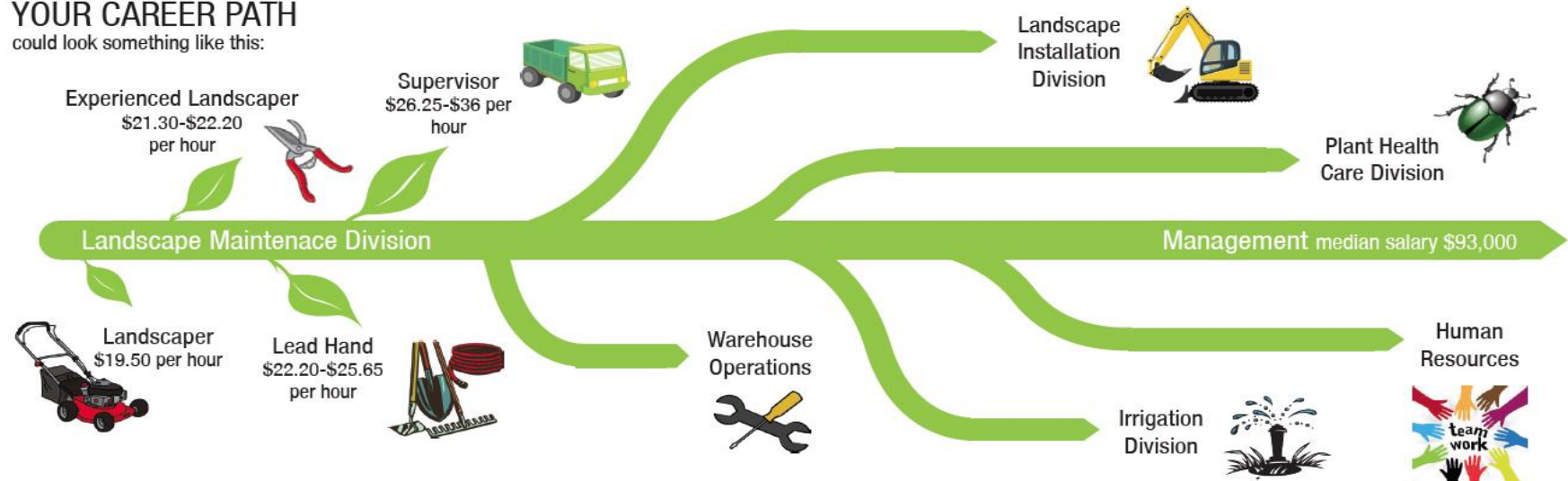

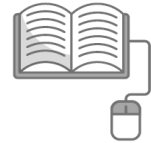

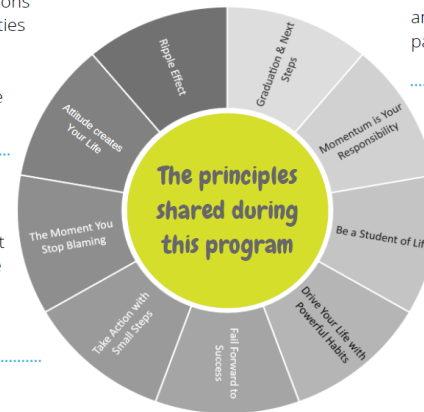

Summer STEM Institute

Making research and mentorship accessible to high school students.

The Summer STEM Institute (SSI) is a 6-week virtual summer program from **June 20 to August 1, 2021**. SSI is an international program that provides academically talented and highly motivated students the opportunity to learn through a data science and research bootcamp, a Masterclass lecture series, weekend challenges, and a mentored research project.

- **Bootcamp:** learn how to design and conduct a data science research project.
- Pursuing research in high school is difficult. Many students are scientifically curious and are eager to conduct research but often lack the right training to do so. The SSI Bootcamp empowers motivated high school students with the training to conduct data science research projects.
- The Summer STEM Institute (SSI) program was started last summer by educators, students, and graduates from Stanford, Harvard, and MIT. Last year, SSI received over 2,450 applications from students in 78 different countries.

Many students who attended the program said SSI changed their lives and asked for the team to continue running SSI in future years. Applications for SSI 2021 have just opened.

The program consists of three main parts:

- **Research and data science bootcamp:** Students learn how to design and conduct data science research projects. Students learn about the research process and how to apply statistical and machine learning methods to address scientific questions with real-world impact.
- **Masterclass lecture series:** Students are connected to accomplished young adults around the world. Students have the opportunity to learn about entrepreneurship from Forbes 30 Under 30 recipients, science research from International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) grand prize winners, and other topics from speakers with diverse backgrounds and experiences.
- **Mentored research project:** Students complete a research project through a rigorous, hands-on learning experience under the guidance of mentors. Previously, students have worked in a variety of fields, from computational biology to quantum physics.

- Adhere to all policies and procedures set out by camp administration.
- Additional duties as directed by camp administration.

Requirements:

- At least 14 years old by July 5th, 2021.
- Ability to commit to a minimum of 2 weeks of volunteering (Non-consecutive weeks is acceptable).
- Attend volunteer training.
- A Criminal Record Check (free of charge) will be **required** upon accepting a position with SFU Camps.

Qualifications:

- A desire to work in a positive environment with children.
- Positive attitude, strong work ethic, flexibility, and willingness to try new activities.
- Responsible and reliable.
- Professionalism.
