## #Indigenoushistorymonth

Mary Two-Axe was a Mohawk Indigenous woman born on the Kahnawake reserve in Quebec. When Mary was only 18 years old she moved to New York City where she met her husband, Edward Earley. After marrying she was unable to participate and embrace her culture due to the oppressive laws set in place for Indigenous Women, rules were changing so she changed them. She pushed serval bills amending the Indian act to remove measures of stripping indigenous women of their culture and heritage after marriage. And she founded the Equal Rights of Indian Women Association in 1968.
