### McFaul's Chat and Chew: "Fatty Legs" An Historical Primary Source

We do not often have much opportunity in our study of history to meet and hear directly from a living primary resource, an actual person who lived through the experience of them being studied. That opportunity was presented to our school community last Thursday with the presence of 83-year-old, Margaret Pokiak-Fenton and her daughter in law – Christy Jordan-Fenton. The story of Fatty Legs is a children's book written about the residential school experience of the author's mother in law, Margaret Pokiak-Fenton. Our students met the author, Christy Jordan-Fenton and shared in her discussion of how she came to write this book. They also met the subject of the book, Margaret Pokiak-Fenton.

*She was born on Baille Island in the Arctic Ocean, en route with her nomadic family to their winter hunting grounds on Banks Island. Being Inuvialuit, her young childhood was filled with hunting trips by dogsled and dangerous treks across the Arctic Ocean for supplies, in a schooner known as the North Star. At the age of eight, she travelled to Aklavik, a fur trading settlement founded by her great-grandfather, to attend the Catholic residential school there. Unlike most children, she begged to go to the residential school, despite the horrific reputation of such institutions. There was nothing she wanted more than to learn how to read.*

Our students heard firsthand from Margaret the stories of her witness accounts of the different ways in which residential schools worked to eradicate the culture of the First Nations People and through these repeated actions of challenge, thus questioning the first nations youth about their identity. Margaret shared the accounts of her having her hair cut and what the significance of having long hair meant to her peoples culture, about them being forced to wear different clothes that were ill-suited for the climate conditions of which her people have lived and adapted to for thousands of years. She told the story of learning to read and starting with, A – is for Apple and where does an apple come from? – which was unbeknownst to her because she had never seen a tree, having lived above the arctic tree line. All small events in isolation but when compiled together it showed a systemic attempt to change one's cultural understanding of who they are and what they believed. The gym was very focussed on the times when Margaret shared her firsthand accounts of life in a residential school and in the far north, and her daughter-in-law made the symbolic connections to the characters and plot lines within the short story. A special day for us to have history come alive through the words of a participant along with the black and white photos of her experiences of living in the far northern Arctic. ### **Books to Compliment Fatty Legs**

**Proud to Be Inuvialuit** – Co-written by Margaret's brother. It explores Inuvialuit culture in a contemporary, yet traditional context. Important not only as a cultural resource, but also as an illustration that Indigenous peoples are still here and still practicing traditional culture.

**The Inuit Thought of It** and **The Native Americans Thought of It** The books explore Inuit and Native American technology still used today. This is important because people often justify residential school or colonization by explaining that the settlers were more advanced. Looking at the inventions portrayed allows students to understand a different perspective.

**Parent Education - Vaping Awareness & Health Presentation**– This is a unique opportunity for parents/guardians to deepen their understanding of the vaping situation that is complex and growing in popularity amongst our youth. We are hosting a **Parent Educations Session on Tuesday November 26<sup>th</sup> @ 6:30 – 7:20** in the Library, presented by SFU Health Sciences Students in conjunction with our Fraser District Public Health nurse. Our Gr. 8 students are participating in presentations and we have a wonderful opportunity to partner their learning with your learning. The presentation is meant to be informative on the harms and risks associated with vaping and then involve an opportunity for more informal discussions and questioning about the social implications that young adolescents face when presented with making the decisions around this substance that is illegal to sell to anyone under the age of 19. Vaping is not just limited to cigarettes as it can also be used for other substances like cannabis and being aware of the various devices can be very challenging to identify by sight smell or design use.



## Winter Weather Ahead!

Schools are not routinely closed due to snow or other inclement weather conditions. All schools in School District 43 (Coquitlam) will remain OPEN, if at all possible, during winter weather, including snowfall.

However, on occasion, a district-wide or partial-district closure is required due to extreme weather. Partial-district closures affecting individual schools may occur due to the very different geography within our school district. If there is a partial-district closure affected schools will be identified.

The decision on schools remaining open or needing to be closed, because of extreme weather, occurs **before 6:30 a.m.** so that families can plan and make alternate arrangements.

**Any district-wide or partial-district closure will be decided and communicated by 6:30 a.m. via the School District 43 website [www.sd43.bc.ca](http://www.sd43.bc.ca) and CKNW AM 980 radio, CKWX 1130 radio and CBC (690) radio.**
