McFaul's Chat and Chew: Working WITH the Kids.

I spent my Professional Development Day on Friday working with over fifty educators and our group leader who is a leading practitioner in Restorative Practices/ Justice from California. During our working sessions the key point was to be working **WITH** the students to enhance their most optimal learning environment.

This is a situation of having high student expectations and maximum adult support for building strong human relationships. By working **WITH** students as people to be honoured and to have an unconditional acceptance in working together is the part of the concept of being **WITH**. The **WITH** part means working side by side, sitting at the same level or conversing together shoulder to shoulder. Which is different from the other options of working TO your students to *manage* them, or FOR your students to *meet their needs* or NOT working which has the relationship of *neglecting and rejecting* the student as a partner in learning. The working **WITH** avoids the power differential of the adults having power over the students and relies on building a trust that nurtures the capacity of all people and their environment that is inclusive, collaborative and allows all involved to act in ways that are healing and developmental rather than power dimensions that alienate and are coercive.

The nurturing journey of working **WITH** needs to focus on the path, not just the destination. We adults tend to dramatically discount the present moment in favor of future outcomes. Yet childhood is a fleeting time. We need to be fostering healthy relationships that develop social emotional learning in all its core competencies – self-awareness, social awareness, self-management, responsible decision making and relationship skills. We should be encouraging the children in our care to revel in their childhood, not hurry out of it as if children were mini adults on a fast-track to paying income taxes and signing on to a low rate mortgage. The path of building relationships requires us to look at honouring growth above proficiency. The idea of working **WITH** students to see their individual and incremental growth in academic steps be it numeracy or literacy, is far more significant than an overall mark of a letter grade on a report card. The challenge of acknowledging these small nuances in learning by the teachers and by you the parent/ guardian helps to ensure that the growing **WITH** one another is an aspect and feature that supports lifelong learning and healthy relationships amongst all. We as teachers are workers of gradual miracles and we model patience like the green gardeners, who, know how long seeds take to grow. It's hard work tilling the soil, nurturing the first fragile green tendrils, and staying vigilant when frosts or plague threaten the seedlings' survival. As teachers and parents, the work of sustaining a gradual miracle requires incredible patience. If we can teach ourselves that hard habit, our students/ children will grow. They may also learn to slow down, delight in the present, and take time to fully experience the many moments before the harvest.

The quickest way to change another person's behavior is to change your behavior towards them so by working **WITH** kids we have a greater chance of changing their life outcomes. Kids are going to make mistakes. But if you make it a point to enjoy being **WITH** them, and treat them **WITH** great respect and care, there is almost no mistake you can't correct. They will be far more open to your feedback when they feel that you like them and enjoy them. I know that I get a much better result in working **WITH** students when I make it a point to enjoy being **WITH** them. They don't always act just like I want, but I do enjoy being **WITH** them anyway.

School Happenings: Events and Activities.

Gr. 5 Parent Night Open House Activities – This event is upcoming on the calendar and it will involve some more opportunities for our current students to showcase their school and their leadership skills. We will be asking our students to help share information about our Academic programs, Explorations, Athletics, Fine Arts – Band and Choir Programs and the various clubs that happen throughout the year.

We invite all our Gr. 5 incoming students and their families to participate in this event to come and learn about what middle school will look, sound and feel like for all of those involved.

The evening starts with the following timelines as we aim to meet the needs of the various academic programs:

- MACC Program Gr. 5 Students and Families are expected to attend 6:00 – 6:30 for an introduction.
- All Gr. 5 Students and Families are invited to join our student ambassadors for a tour of the school.
- All Gr. 5 Students and Families are then expected to join our staff in the gym from 7:00 – 8:00.

Even if you are a parent and this is your second or third child that has attended Hillcrest, we ask that you honour that younger sibling by dedicating the time to celebrate their transition to middle school and learn along with them so that they feel special just like their older siblings did when they moved onto Hillcrest.

International Bring Your Child to Work Day – On Thursday our school clientele might look a little different in terms of age groups as many of our staff will be asking their children to join them at school to celebrate this significant international day of recognition. We will have younger ones that will be popping in for short sessions to spend part of their day with their parent and older ones who might be able to provide another perspective on some in-class tutoring opportunities. We encourage you to talk to your employer and to discuss this small window of opportunity to have your child experience a day in the life of your work world. This can be an enlightening and worthy experience as our students and children learn to see the vast options of work experiences that exist and may cease to exist by the time they are employable.

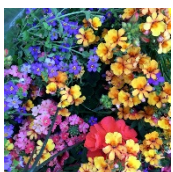
