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McFaul's Chat and Chew: The Art of Reporting Absenteeism

Over the past few weeks we have seen an increasing number of absents in our students due to a variety of issues and opportunities, none to say the least is the improvement in good weather. Hold your run-away thoughts because we are not talking about the old-fashioned idea of skipping school as we have not witnessed this type of behaviour at Hillcrest. Moreover, this is a simple rise in students being absent. This could be due to an illness or flu bug impacting more of our population or it could be due to the opportunities for families to find time to connect beyond the weekend parameters. Recently with the warm weather we have more students outside running, moving, playing football, soccer, kickball and sometimes they forget to look where they are going and – BANG we have a head on collision resulting in some minor injuries and more serious concussed heads. For others it could be the increase in outside activities like sports or clubs that now sneak into the “work week” and through this meaningful encroachment of time the minutes at school gets slightly whittled away, all for good reasons that provide growth to students in many other areas of life. For others it could simply be the case of suffering from a one day “sunitis bout” which provided some rest and relaxation for all in the family.

We ask you to help us be as vigilante as possible in the management and communication of your child's absence due to any reason. The tracking and confirming a student's absence is our first assignment of the morning to ensure all have arrived safely and to verify student absences with a parent/guardian contact. Your support by using our online absence report or by phoning into the school to leave a message if you call before 8:00 and if you call after by informing our wonderful office clerical staff, who work diligently to get the attendance data out to our teachers and most importantly to confirm with you that all is safe and sound with your child on the school front. See the Absence Report on the right-hand side of the page and click. Fill in the required information fields and hit submit. This simplifies the process and helps in our two -way communications between school and home. Now, back to the claim of a bout of “sunitis”, it is a rare malady that inflicts one or a family in need of some downtime and rest and relaxation for a day to reconnect with maybe a walk on a sunny day, a favourite sunny location to spend time together or a sunny snack on the back deck. All have been known to be required for maintaining your sanity and your sense of purpose with your child.

School Happenings: **Events and Activities.**

Frantic Friday – Many of our students will be having multiple options as to what activities they will need to choose from for their Friday activities as we have a great diversity of conflicting schedules and events. These activities are all purposeful, but they will require careful thought and consideration on behalf of their commitment and sense of personal responsibility.

On Friday May 11th we have the following activities unfolding:

- **Kiwanis – Advanced Band Festival at Langley** – all members of the Advanced Band must be attending this event as Band is a credited course and requires performance-based criteria and participation by all members.
- **District Track & Field Meet at Town Centre** – Athletes that are participating will have to have met the district standards for their specific event. Athletes will be informed by their coaches of their participation in the exact events that they have qualified for in advance of this date. Not all athletes will be able to meet the standards and thus will not be participating in this event.
- **Dr. Charles Best School Play – A Midsummer Night's Dream** – Will have the student from Red and Orange Team and Div. 13/14 from Yellow Team participating in this theatrical event. Students will be walking over the Best Secondary with staff and will have the opportunity to see older peers they know

perform in a Shakespearean play. If the student is in Advanced Band or has met the athletic standards for the Track & Field meet, then they will be required to miss the play performance.

- **MACC Biennale Art Project** – The students in our MACC program will be doing some pre- project learning on the Biennale Art for which they will be working on and touring to view in the coming weeks.

All good and challenging opportunities for our students to showcase their talents and aspire towards greater dreams as they prepare for new experiences in their learning world.

Class Building for 2018 – 2019- Now is the time of year when we start to structure our staffing and our student grade configurations for next year. This is a long and detailed process involving many aspects of each child's learning profile and their social relationships with peers and staff. We take into all accounts the perspectives of the professionals that we know have relationships with your children and then we place together a plan that we feel best fits the learning environment for them and one that we can provide with our staffing arrangements. The principal has the responsibility for final placement of each student. This development of class lists is given a great deal of time, careful thought and understanding with the knowledge teachers have of each student and what will be in the child's best interest.

Factors Considered are:

- “ Academic achievement
- “ Behaviour issues
- “ Previous placement history
- “ Parental recommendations
- “ Learning styles
- “ Recommendations of teachers and school-based team
- “ Instructional groupings
- “ Teaching styles
- “ Class composition
- “ Social groupings
- “ Class size

Parent input is also considered provided that it is received **in writing by letter or email** to the principal, Mr. McFaul, **before May 18th, 2018**. Please note that the focus of parent letters should be about their own children and their needs and **should be based on sound educational reasons**. Please keep in mind that requests must be related to your child's specific learning needs and style. Due to many placement factors and the allowable class size, we may not be able to accommodate all requests. Requests for peer placement or suggestions regarding the placement of other children should respectfully be avoided. While we guarantee that all parent input will be given careful consideration, we cannot promise that all requests will be met due to the above challenges.

Preparing for a Lockdown Drill – On Wednesday May 9th around 9:00am we will be practicing our procedures for a safe Lockdown Drill. This is a very important event and one that we will be sharing with our students over the next week about ways that they can ensure they are prepared for a safe drill practice. The drill is the highest level of school safety that we as a community can practice and one that we hope will never have to use. Like a Hold and Secure Drill, which we have completed earlier this year the basic procedures are similar; However, the purpose of a Lockdown Drill is to practice our procedures in the event of a threat or a weaponized risk of violence that is inside the school structure. For this practice we will have some RCMP staff do a safety procedure walk through with our admin team to help us identify areas of concern and to fine tune our procedures with students and staff. The why of such an event is obvious, the how is where we want to discuss with our students in advance about what actions they need to do to ensure safety for all.

- Students will hear the following PA message – Three Times – Lockdown, Lockdown, Lockdown
- Students will be secured in their classroom or nearest room
- Doors locked, and lights turned off and windows covered
- Students will be placed in their room to ensure that visual sightlines to them are reduced
- Staff take attendance of students present and missing individuals
- Staff will monitor information through their district email
- Silence is expected
- Use of cellphones is prohibited to safeguard safety for all
- Doors are not to be opened to anyone
- Think Safety first before social-media opportunity
- The drill will be over with a PA message – Three Times – All Clear, All Clear, All Clear
- Once we have completed our drill with our RCMP support we will review the drill with our community

Please take the time over the coming week to discuss school safety in general and how being prepared is not to be feared; moreover, it is to be confirm in your child's mind that they know why we practice, what to do and how to feel in control of their world.

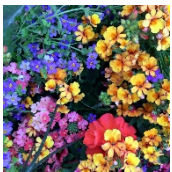
