#### Video of the Winter Concert

We are in the process of seeing if we can do this through the cash online system, but if not, donations can be dropped off at the school. Some technical notes about downloading the video(s):

The video was filmed and edited in 4K Ultra High Definition. When viewing online the video player will automatically select the highest resolution that your monitor and internet speed will allow. Do be careful when viewing the videos repeatedly online using your cell phone data.

You can also download the videos so that you have a local copy. Below is what the drop-down looks like when you click the download button below the video. There are 8 different resolution, file size, and codec options.

I am going to suggest that the majority of you will want to download the HD 1080P version or the UHD 4K versions. These use the H.264 codec and are MP4 video files that you can playback on pretty much any device that accepts video files.

The other option is the 'Original' version, which is the master HEVC H.265 video file. This version has a smaller bitrate as it uses a more efficient codec but it does not play back on as many devices.

### School Closure due to Inclement Weather

With next week currently showing that we may get snow (on my weather app anyways), it seems like a good time to remind parents about the process of school closures when the weather gets bad. As a general expectation, schools will remain open. If extreme weather conditions cause you to be unsure or if local conditions are unsafe, you may keep your child at home or arrange for an early dismissal. If schools are to be closed before morning classes begin, an announcement will be made on local radio stations (CKWX news 1130; CKNW 980) early in the morning. If schools in the district are closed for the day, you will be able to find out on our district webpage (www.sd43.bc.ca) by 7:00am (at the latest).

If there is an accumulation of snow, please remember to dress students in clothing suitable for playing in the snow, to avoid disappointment and cold fingers. Snow pants and boots are always a great idea and don't forget an extra pair of gloves or mitts. Please be sure that even on those wet days (when schools are not closed) that you make sure that your children are dressed appropriately for the weather as we will be outside as often as possible. We want students to come to school prepared for the outdoors in much the same way we expect them to be prepared to learn indoors.

While we do our best to make sure that salt is on the ground on these colder days, please remind your children to be careful in the mornings as it can be very slippery, especially on wood and leaves. Cement can also be misleading, especially at the back of the school, where less sunlight gets through (especially in the early morning hours).

## Drop off in the morning

Thank you to those who are using the drop off on Renton. We are still seeing parents dropping off their students on Wellington St., just in front of the school. Please use Renton as the drop off for your children. As I've mentioned several times, dropping your children off on Wellington is not safe. It impacts the view of the crosswalk for drivers travelling in the opposite direction, and also puts you at risk for anyone who is travelling north along Wellington who does not see you. This is one of the reasons for the drop off area - to eliminate Wellington as a drop off option.

Please also note that students should not be arriving early to school. Some students are arriving prior to 8:00am and there is no supervision at this time.
