The idea behind allowing snowballs is to provide opportunities for students to have some fun and to show them how they can have fun within a set of rules - rules that are in place to best ensure to lessen the chance of an injury and to allow for opportunities for fun, without things getting carried away. Students are told that the idea behind throwing snowballs is to have fun. As such, facewashes, close range head shots, putting snow down someone's back or in their clothes, and ganging up on one person are not to happen. I have found that when students are given an opportunity with expectations in place, they will often raise to the level of the expectations that are provided. If this is difficult, there are consequences to remind them about what they need to do to correct their behavior. While we were only able to throw snowballs on Monday (the snow turned into ice by Tuesday), hopefully we will be able to have more fun outside.

Drop off in the morning / traffic

Please remember to move forward as far as you can (and not to stop simply at the stairs near the portable) and once you have dropped off your child, please move out of the area o that others can drop off their children. Following this will minimize the risk of any accident happening (the parking lot can be a very busy place, especially in the morning). Kindergarten registration will take place from February 3rd to 5th. Please be sure to register your children at this time. Parents need to register their child at their catchment school (based on their home address). If you wish to request a transfer to a different school, you'll need to complete a cross catchment application form. This form is completed on line and will be available from Feb. 6th to Feb. 12th. Please feel free to pass this information on to any parents who do not have children already in school.

If parents wish to transfer to another school, they have to complete an online cross catchment form. Schools accepting students through the cross-catchment process do so only if they have available space. The cross-catchment process begins on Feb. 6th (at 9:00am) and runs until Feb. 12 (4:00pm)

School Closure due to Inclement Weather

With the possibility of snow happening later this week, it's a good time to remind parents about the process of school closures when the weather gets bad. As a general expectation, schools will remain open. If extreme weather conditions cause you to be unsure or if local conditions are unsafe, you may keep your child at home or arrange for an early dismissal. If schools are to be closed before morning classes begin, an announcement will be made on local radio stations (CKWX news 1130; CKNW 980) early in the morning. If schools in the district are closed for the day, you will be able to find out on our district webpage (www.sd43.bc.ca) by 7:00am (at the latest). I will also do my best to provide updates to parents to let them know what the conditions are like around the school.

If there is an accumulation of snow, please remember to dress students in clothing suitable for playing in the snow, to avoid disappointment and cold fingers. Snow pants and boots are always a great idea and don't forget an extra pair of gloves or mitts. Please be sure that even on those wet days (when schools are not closed) that you make sure that your children are dressed appropriately for the weather as we will be outside as often as possible. We want students to come to school prepared for the outdoors in much the same way we expect them to be prepared to learn indoors.

While we do our best to make sure that salt is on the ground on these colder days, please remind your children to be careful in the mornings as it can be very slippery, especially on wood and leaves. Cement can also be misleading so please be careful.
