VALUE OF THE WEEK (Feb. 3-7) - revisiting SELF CONTROL

Kindergarten Registration / cross catchment information

<u>Kindergarten registration takes place from February 3rd to 5th</u>. Please be sure to register your children at this time. Parents need to register their child at their catchment school (based on their

home address). If you wish to request a transfer to a different school, you'll need to complete a cross catchment application form. <u>The cross-catchment form is completed on line and will be available</u> <u>from Feb. 6th (9:00am) to Feb. 12th (4:00pm)</u>. Please feel free to pass this information on to any parents who do not currently have children already in school, but who have children that will be starting kindergarten in September.

Student Led Conferences / Early Dismissal

On Tuesday, Feb. 4th, we will be having our student led conferences. This is an early dismissal day (students will be dismissed at 1:48). It is important during the student led conferences that you let your child lead this event. They will have an agenda to follow. This is their opportunity to show you what they have done and what they are learning. Please allow them to do this. Student led conferences are not the time to talk with the classroom teacher about how your child is doing. This can be arranged at a future date. Allowing your child to lead gives them an opportunity to build their confidence and to take an active role in their learning. More information will be provided by your child's teacher.

Mr. Liew has sent out a link to arrange an interview with the parents from his class (Division 2). If you cannot make a meeting at the available times, please contact him to set up another meeting. This time will allow him to provide you with the progress your child has shown over the past month. It will also allow the parents to ask any questions about their child's progress.

Tennis is Fun program

The Tennis is Fun Program will be returning to Irvine. Our PAC has generously provided money which will subsidize the cost. Each classroom will get five lessons for a total of \$6. We will have this up on our school cash on-line system in the next day or two. This program has been to our school before and our students have greatly enjoyed the experience of playing tennis!

Bikes and Scooters on the School Grounds

We know that as the weather gets nicer out, more of our students will ride their scooters and / or bikes to school. Recently, there have been a couple of accidents that have happened while on the school grounds. Please remind your child - we will too - that when riding bikes or scooters to school, they should not be ridden while on school property. Rather, dismounting and walking them while on the school grounds is the expectation. Thank you.

Traffic - afternoon expectations

Thank you to all of you who have tried to make the morning drop off procedures go as smoothly as possible. As the expectations for the morning are becoming clearer to more and more people, I feel it necessary to talk about the expectations at the end of the day (for pick up).

Please understand that I am one person and there are days when I cannot make it outside (because of meetings at the school or away from the school, or because there are other things that I have to deal with). I appreciate the efforts that people are making to make things run smoothly and I am also aware that with changes, time is necessary when changing the expectations or when we have to learn new expectations. My hope is that people will remember this and will make the right choices regardless of whether I am outside or not.

To clarify, dropping off a child means simply that: pulling over and letting your child out of the car. For those with young children, I have no problem with you exiting your car to let your child out. They key piece here is that you cannot leave with them to their classroom. Once they have exited the car, you can say your goodbye's and then enter back into your car to continue to move so that others can do the same thing. PLEASE NOTE: when you leave your car, even just to let your child out, please turn off the engine (there was an accident in Ontario in January 2018 in which a car that was unoccupied and running fatally injured a young student. <u>Story here</u>).

In the afternoon, there are some parents who make their way to Renton before the bell. If you are "parked" on Renton, you MUST stay in your vehicle (and again, please turn your engine off). Do not leave your vehicle to meet your child. Instead, let your child know ahead of time that you will be there and have them come to meet you at your car. If you believe your child is too small to do this then you should be parking somewhere else (which will allow you to come to your child's classroom and meet him/her). It is also crucial that when you are on Renton, that you move, legally, as far forward as you can. I say legally because it has come to my attention that some vehicles park at the bottom of the hill which makes the turn around area less easy to navigate. Finally, under no circumstances is anyone to double park or to stop next to an already stopped car and then encourage their child to come out to the vehicle. This is simply an accident waiting to happen.

Please be careful driving up and down the hill on Renton. While things can get quite busy, I have found (in the mornings) that the "busy" time does not last for a particularly long time. By practicing what I have outlined, things can and will go more smoothly and more importantly, more safely.
