- May 17<sup>th</sup> Celebration of learning Assembly and Showcase of Kindergarten Art in collaboration with the community and United Way Avenue of Change (this is an Organization based on research from UBC re: kindergarten learning and community support) the kindergarteners worked together to create the little learning library and decorative pole on display in the school lobby.
- New School update:

- Enrollment at Irvine:

  - Gifted children are still identified half way through grade 3 and are placed in specific classrooms learning alongside children at similar levels – with smaller class size now this will be beneficial to everyone
  - Support staff budget has been redirected to aiding children identified with unique learner profiles who need individual learning plans
- Are there any specific Science programs/clubs in the school and will there be a science lab in the new school?
  - Science is integrated across all learning strands during the school year
  - o Middle School will offer more of a specific focus on science study
  - Let Principal Birnie know if there are any specific areas of interest parents have and she can work with you to see where that can be integrated – i.e. teachers have since decided to open Art Start to some other science related programs (TBD at the May PAC meeting)
