This past week we enjoyed our first PAC sponsored cultural presentation. The amazing <u>D.O. Gibson</u> shared his music and inspirational message with us all. The positive messages from people like D.O. (which stands for Defy the Odds) are important for our students to hear, especially when they are bombarded with so much negativity on social media. I hope your child came home and mentioned the presentation, if not, ask them what they remembered (and ask them again and again when they shrug their shoulders and say they don't know!).

Speaking of positive messages, during our first few weeks back after winter break, I have noticed an increase (if that is possible) in how negative social media posts are affecting our students. It is rare for a day to go by that I do not talk to a student that has been harmed by someone that has posted something mean (or shared something mean they have read). One of the most challenging things is the fact many students have multiple accounts (spam accounts) that they use to hide their identity – and of course, hide their activity. I believe all students (and adults) have the capacity to be kind and caring, and yes, even remorseful when the pain they have caused is uncovered. I hope we are able to turn these events into learning experiences, but unless we help our students understand that we are responsible for our actions, whether carried out virtually or in the real world, I am worried these events will just keep happening.

I often say – we build connections and friendship in two ways – either through common goals, interests, and values or through common enemies and dislikes. I have not been able to find many young adolescents that have developed positive, meaningful, and lasting friendships through online gaming, group chats or social media posts so please set screen limits for your child (the more they protest, the more they need them!) and help provide opportunities for them to experience new things and develop healthy habits and hobbies.

I am so proud of the extra-curricular activities we offer at Maple Creek to encourage involvement and positive connections – hopefully all students choose to get involved in something. Did you know we have the following going on right now: chess club, fashion club, basketball (all grades), wrestling (all grades), yearbook, leadership, intramurals, choir, band, anime club, D&D club and Minecraft club (and others I might have missed?). These opportunities are offered because the staff knows these activities make a difference to students, and allow them to build connection through common interests. Please encourage your child to participate and explore hobbies and interests beyond scrolling through You Tube videos and social media posts!
