We trust this late winter newsletter finds you and your family happy and in good health. Believe it or not, the school year is over half completed! Our grade eight students are in the process of beginning their transition planning to their respective secondary schools and we will soon be visiting all our incoming grade 5 students in April! Additionally, we have begun preliminary discussions and plans for the school organization next year. At press time, our projections for our student population next year will be relatively the same as this year, between 635-650 students. By early May, we will have a much clearer idea regarding our student numbers and staffing and we will be able to report more.

This year, we were happy to fully implement our "Bring Your Own Learning Device" (BYOLD) initiative with students either having heir own devices at school or being lent one from the school. We are forever grateful and feeling fortunate to have had both district support and support from our Parent Advisory Council (PAC) to ensure that we have a robust fleet of laptops and supporting technology so that our staff and students can use this a tool for teaching and learning. We continue to learn about the power of technology as a learning resource and something that compliments the means by which we discover our world and communicate with each other.

We are also thankful for the support of our parent community throughout the course of the COVID-19 pandemic....adjusting to the everchanging protocols that ensures that the safety of our school community is our first and foremost priority. Next week we will begin the next phase of our evolution with school based COVID-19 protocols. Starting next week students will no longer have to stay in zones for recess and lunch. This will be a welcome change for our students as they can wander freely on our school grounds to hang out and play wherever they like. Students will still go to their pickup locations at the beginning of the day and will be escorted into and out of the building to ensure there is no overcrowding within the building. The second change is that students will once again be allowed to use their lockers starting next Wednesday. After spring break if there are no changes to the Public Health Officers recommendations, we will continue to open things up with assemblies, band and choir concerts, the spring play and a shift back to some regular school routines. However, we will be introducing these slowly, carefully and with care for everyone's safety.

As we work toward welcoming our incoming Grade 6 students next year, we are hopeful that we can have them visit out school for our grade 6 for half a day in June and to have our parents welcomed into the school for our Grade 5 parent open house in late April.
