## School update:

- Student learning Survey - completed by grade 7 students. Parents in grade 4, 7 and 10 are invited for their feedback. Please see link:

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- Second wave of BYOLD pilot program - In January, we had four classes that started. This term after spring break, 2 more classes will join. There will be a district information meeting with the district principal. Will be happy to extend an invitation to parents at this meeting.
- Student government has taken over the school. Lots of organizing. Multicultural lunch should've been this week. It's a good community builder for parents. Few things planned for this week for Multicultural Day. Kahoot will be played tomorrow for prizes or spirit points. Will be played as a class. Friday, students are welcome to wear traditional clothing or a jersey from their country or colour of their flags. Lots of options. Cooking challenge and cookbook - students were encouraged to cook, share recipes and pictures. Classes have been making chinese lanterns as a celebration of the lunar new year.
- Following week is Real Acts of Care. We will have Monty grams notes/letters to kids of other classes. Everyone gets notes and smarties. All notes are quarantined and distributed a week later.
- Student Making Change
- PRIDE day - inclusion
- Black History Month - celebrated all month long. Invited all staff of that community for input. It's celebratory, contemporary and a contribution to the community.
- Minute it to win it - 5 different challenges that takes a minute. Full representation of each kid doing something. ie how many turns of skipping rope in a minute.
- Public speeches coming up. Class, entire school and district
competition.


## Question and answer:

- Exposure - first letter sent out to the entire school. Subset will be sent to those who may be exposed. Closing letter, exposure is over and no need to monitor. Any questions?
- Question - can you clarify mask policy -- there seems to be some differences in classes. ie...one class wears masks at all times except when eating lunch; another class, students do not have to wear them when they are at their desks.
- Students are to wear masks unless they are at their desks, eating or in the hang out area.
- Question - Is that a teachers choice as well?
- They can encourage students but not require them to.
- It could be from an Expo teacher as they are not part of their learning group. Their contact is four classes not just one so that could be required from the expo teachers.
- We had encouraged the students to do so already from the beginning so it wasn't a massive change for our community with the new orders from PHO. For most kids, it wasn't a big change.
- Morning announcements is an easy way to communicate and encourage and remind each other of those requirements.
- Interm reports will go home tomorrow and will have a link for a two question survey.
- Questions: There was a statement in the newsletter about many kids are still coming in late. What is done?
- Top 15 are contacted and spoken to. Some families are dealing with challenges. Most effective way to communicate is by phoning and connecting with them.
- Youth worker - we have a new youth worker. It's great to have one again. We didn't have one for 2 weeks. Youth worker is someone who will work with the students who are chronically late. Before, teachers will have them stay after school. But the youth worker will work with these students and have a plan. Usually, the first thing we always ask is "what happened?"
- Questions: is it a problem if kids are early?
- First entry, not a problem. Second entry can be a problem since it overlaps with the first group.
- Question: Is counsellor coming from Centennial the same day the course selection forms are due? Will there be a chance to ask questions about electives?
- It, usually, will work out.
- Backpack buddies on Friday: appreciate having a youth worker. Been a long 10 days. Having different people shopping can be a challenge with different people coming in. Having someone who is consistent or divides the two shopping will be better. Costco shopping is once a month and superstore shopping uses gift cards. (Christine Friend offered to do the Costco shopping. Looking for help for superstore shopping. For now, Kim will continue.)
- Executive director at kidsports is a friend and donated 25 soccer balls, looking for badminton rackets and birdies. Request from PAC is a $\$ 100$ donation to kidsports. (Linda and Kim will look into that)
- Thank you for the money for athletics. Tether balls will be set up soon.
