- 3. President's Message: Linda Intihar:

Thank you Sarah, Deana and staff for the open house via zoom. Worked very well. Welcome to everyone. Your thoughts/ideas are always welcomed and valued. PAC minutes, budget updates and other communication items are posted on the Montgomery website under the PAC heading.

4. Treasurer's Report: Kim Cameron

- a. Proposed Budget for 2020/2021 -See attached sheet
 - i. We needed to reflect a tight budget since we do not know how things will progress this year.
 - ii. School account = \$0 since we will not ask for donations this year
 - iii. Gaming account
 - expecting \$9600 based on number of students but haven't heard confirmation. Will hear by the end of Oct. Right now we have approximately \$1847.88. Expenses are based on school priorities (technology or sports

equipment about \$5000 each) option to move \$2000 to sports based on how things go with everything. Total expense about \$10K.

iv. General account

- 1. Gift cards that we bought last year for hot lunch were donated to the school breakfast/lunch program.
- Students leaving ceremony: we wanted to keep that the same for the grade 8s and recognize them. Last year we were able to give each student a gift certificate to Rocky Point Ice Cream .
- 3. Teachers' discretionary funds we put at \$500 because we have limited income this year and in the past has always come from parents' donations. Staff appreciation could be adjusted to discretionary funds instead. Discretionary funds are used for projects, supplies, etc. that teachers feel they need to enhance their classroom learning that are not paid for by the school. Motion to change name to Supplementary Classroom materials a more accurate description of the fund. We would like to support them in this area.

v. Questions/Discussion arising from proposed budget:

- What is the plan for technology? Maybe some new devices, maybe apps, depending on school needs. Sarah probably at this point, there is not a need to increase the laptops but for accessories for the devices (ie speakers to give better audio in classrooms.) \$5000 will easily accommodate.
- 2. What's the game plan for how much to save for the aging out devices? Is there a long term plan? Do we have that forecasted? Sarah Bring your own device will be our aim as our devices age out. Right now, we will start with four classes and maybe/hopefully, after spring break will be four more classes. That will help us and decrease the burden but there will be other kinds of devices that will help in other ways. We are hoping the need will come down but the reality is that we will have to live within our means.

- 3. Sports/school culture do we know what we will be doing? Spending on? PAC has previously purchased outdoor equipment. We did a survey from the classes to see what else they need. Not quite enough sports equipment because use of it is way up and kids are playing like before (1970) which is wonderful. Some of the equipment ended up on the roof but they were brought down recently.
- 4. As a response to not being able to provide sufficient money in our budget for teachers' discretionary funds and finding out we can't do fundraisers, we needed to revisit prior decisions
 - a. Revisited from the October meeting where we decided not to do Parent donation letters. Linda didn't feel right asking parents for donations. We thought parents could prioritize where their money went, for example, parents could put that money toward other areas like saving for laptops for their children or the breakfast/lunch program.
 - b. We are now aware that district policy does not support fundraisers at the moment. A discussion occurred "Are people in favour of asking for parents' donations in a very respectful way?".
 - c. Motion to proceed with a donation letter -approved by all.

*Manjit will help draft the letter and will run it by Linda and Sarah, before the November newslette. Donations we get will be bonus. We will meet our requirement for fundraising with the gaming policies too.

*Money we collect will be allocated to supplementary classroom supplies (previously named teacher discretionary funds) and other high priority needs (such as lunch equipment)

getting laptops for a classroom before. Other groups have been doing services (ie a chef teaches how to cook or make drinks via zoom) Great idea, to help. Kimberley T. will help Linda with this. The school receives some donations from Superstore for the breakfast club.

Covid protocol

* if there's an exposure at the school. Sarah presented a slide to help more people understand the process. Have to follow directions from Fraser Health. Enormous amount of information would be needed to give to Fraser Health, so they can decide who needs to be contacted. If there's an exposure, the community will be notified. But the people who are directly involved, would only be informed. It's a learning process. Our colleagues are learning about it too. Hard part for our community is the degree of knowledge does not happen unless it's directly impacted.

b. Question and answer time

- i. If there were an exposure and the families are notified, do the rest of the household need to be quarantined? The rest of the family may have to self isolate until they are notified. It would be self Isolate, test, depending on results and living circumstances, they may be allowed to go to school or to work.
 - Who manages Monty hoodies? Very reasonable price. Some of the staff. It's for spiritwear. Creating normalcy. Important to keep the tradition.
 - Mask could we hire a seamstress to cut the cost down? Like the idea as a spiritwear. Keep it generic to the school. Versatility for all.
 - What will sponsor a family for Christmas look like this year? Look mainly like gift cards. Last year we funded 10 baskets through the Christmas Market and other resources; portions of it were gift cards but this year there will be more gift cards. - Question on emergency supplies? In the past, we had a storage container outside but it was broken into so it's moved inside with outside access. Do we need to do more? Absolutely.
