## Hold and Secure - January 26th

As part of our Health and Safety work in SD43, practicing drills for emergency situations is part of our learning and practice. Fire drills, earthquake drills and lockdown drills are examples of the procedures we engage in throughout our schools. Previously known as a Code Yellow Lockdown, the newly named **Hold and Secure** procedure is practiced annually. Hold and Secure is a procedure which allows the school to continue with the normal school day, but forbids outside activity and unnecessary room-to-room transit. No unauthorized personnel are to enter the building. Hold and Secure is most commonly used when an incident is occurring outside the school building, on or off school property, and there is no immediate or active threat. A Hold and Secure may be initiated by the Police or by School Administrators. We will be having our drill next week on January 26<sup>th</sup> in the morning. Our liaison office Rob DeGoey will be on site to help evaluate our drill.

#### Self-Regulation and a New Ride

Self-Regulation is a lens not a trend that looks at one's ability to manage their own energy states, including emotions, behaviours and attention in ways that are socially acceptable. We all have strategies as adults that we have developed over time for working through difficult and challenging situations. Grabbing a coffee and morning shower are two strategies adults may use to help with alertness. Turning down lights and listening to soft music may be strategies for calming down.

In essence, there's no sense in trying to get a student to take in information if they aren't in a calm and alert state. Think of a time when you were rattled by either a car accident or close call catching a flight. If we were to ask you to render your full energy and attention to learning something new you would need to call on some strategies to work through in the moment. Students in middle school have a lot to contend with: social pressures, lack of sleep, brain changes, learning a new skill etc.

Our job as educators is to help students develop core competencies in communication, personal and cultural identity and creative and critical thinking. "...Self-regulatory skills equip students with a more positive view towards their futures, empower them to manage their social behavior, and support the development of lifelong learning skills"-Peters, et al. (2013)

Rob DeGoey our Police Liaison Officer is a member of our staff at EMMSOTA. He understands the needs of our students and positively impacts our school community regularly. We feel very fortunate to be able to work with Rob and feel highly supported by him and the rest of the team at the Port Moody Police. Together we are creating a positive community connection for students to experience. This week Rob has added to our school with financial support from his department to purchase a stationary bike for our Learning Support Centre. We are so grateful for the support from Port Moody Police and we look forward to seeing Efosa enjoying the benefits of this donation.
