ADVANCED BAND DAY



We were joined by many other middle schools from around the district as we celebrated music in our schools. Each school performed two songs for each other in a fun afternoon of music-sharing. Coming up in May, the Choir will be performing at the District Music in the Park Day at Lafarge Lake on May 6th and the Jr. Band will participate in Beginner Band Day at Eagle Mountain on May 23rd.



REEL TO REAL FILM FESTIVAL

On Tuesday April 16, Divisions 4, 5 and 6 travelled to the Yaletown Roundhouse for the 26th annual Youth Film festival. Each division watched a series of short films that were thought-provoking and had a Q&A with a filmmaker. Div 4 and 5 saw short films and tales from the point of view and experience of youngsters, small animals and the shortest among us. This mix of remarkable yet brief animated works brought together unforgettable stories and unparalleled creativity. Div 6 saw short films that were dramatic, heartwarming, and put the spotlight on varying cultures, the disparate and nuanced stories of young girls took center stage. As different as they are, the experience of coming of age is universal and full of lessons.

Each division also participated in a workshop related to filmmaking. Div 4 participated in digital Filmmaking. The class learned the functions of a digital video camera, and a few insider tricks. Then students broke into small groups and filmed short scenes on their own inside and outside of the Roundhouse. Div 5 participated in Claymation. Where students shaped and molded characters with plasticine and, using stop motion animation. They created short films in small groups that will be sent to the teachers after the festival. The plasticine was messy, and all kinds of fun! Finally Div 6 students participated in cut out animation. A variety of pre-fashioned and cutout materials was used to create characters and sets. In small groups, using video capture techniques, students were taken through the steps of creating a short story on the topic of the short film program!

Division 12 held a treat sale on Wednesday to raise money for the Terry Fox Foundation. Treats on sale included cupcakes, cookies, candy bags, and more. 




